It is with sadness that I inform members of the passing of two long standing club members of Neville Roach and Brian Farmer who were active members of VVMCCSA during the middle years of the club.





A History of the Veteran & Vintage MCC of South Aust., Inc.

V&V motorcycling has a lengthy history in the crow eating State; in March 1934, a band of enthusiasts in the MCC of SA organised a rally for 'old crock' motorcycles. Chief perpetrators of this lark were Wal Murphy, Jack Moyle, Arnold Hanson & other prominent competition men. Among the machines were FW, Ariel, Peugeot tricar & Triumph. Somewhat as an afterthought, the Sporting Car Club of SA was invited to enter veteran cars, should any be about & going. The whole run was successful, enjoyed by participants & spectators alike.

The evert was repeated next year, & in subsequent years until the War. Organisation was improved, with a collection taken up each time to benefit the Red Cross, & the whole thing became sponsored by the 'Advertiser' newspaper.

After the first couple of runs, the tail began to wag the dog. Veteran car numbers increased while motorcycles faded out. Consequently, control was taken over by the SCC of SA, whichhad developed a Veteran section. This condition persists to the present day, with the Veteran section being the second oldest veteran car club

in the world, beaten by a couple of months by the VCC of GB.

After the end of WW11, interest in veteran & vintage notorcycles gradually increased. Machines were rescued & restored by long time enthusiasts, headed by a prewar entrant, Jack Kaines, & including Jin Thurner, Eddie Ross, Ralph Datlen & Harold Rosenhain. In the middle of 1957, a meeting was held at the home of Tony Lower, & the V&V MCC of SA was formed. Jack Kaines became President & Chairman, Tony Lower Secretary & Harold Rosenhaim Treasurer. After two meetings, the meeting place was transferred to a fancy goods wharehouse; I well remember these meetings, sitting on planks laid between chairs in cramped circumstances with a litter of cellophand wrapping paper on the floor.

Eventually a more permenent home was found in a converted stable & hay lift, rented & restored by the VSCC of SA. A number of car clubs shared this facility; all paid 12/6d per month, ex-- cept for the Rolls Royce Owner's Club, which was given a reduced rate

because of the low state of it's exchequer.

The first public run of the new club w's made at the invitation of the SCC of SA in October 1957, in conjunction with V&V cars. There were 22 starters, almost all of whom finished the run around Adelaide suburbs. As well as the ormipresent Triumphs & Douglases, machines entered included a 1904 Lewis, 1902 Minerva & Moto Reve. Prominent were Jack Kaines (in bearskin cap) & Harold Rosenhain on Triumphs.

In 1958 the club was fortunate in obtaining, for several years, the sponsorship of the Vacuum Oil Co. (Later to become Mobil Oil). Free petrol, oil & trophies were much appreciated by members.

The second run in March 1958 saw 54 entries. Gymkhana events


dn Clarendon oval proved very popular. Among new entries were
Matchless Silver Arrow, shaft drive FN & Stanger two stroke V-twin.

In spite of the large entry to the Clarendon run, the next
few months were critical ones in the young club's existence. Initial enthusiasm tended to diminish with the passing of time(as it usually does)& attendance at the nonthly meetings became smaller & smaller. Now that the problems of forming the club, making it viable, & conducting rallies had been solved, there seemed little to discuss a no reason to attend monthly meetings. There was talk of terminating the club's existence.

At the AGM in July 1958, Mr. Kaines indicated his desire to reliquish the position of President & Chairman. The clubwas fortunate in obtaining a dynamic & hard working experienced Chair-man in the person of Wally Woollatt, who has held the position ever since, & it is a tribute to his drive that the club is thriving &

seems likely to do so indefinitely.

The club's first two day rally was conducted in November 1958, with the assistance of the Adelaide Scouter Club. A well Hodaka was a joint Japanese and American company that manufactured motorcycles from 1964 to 1978. Close to 150,000 motorcycles were produced within that time. Prior to 1964 Hodaka made engines for the Yamaguchi motorcycle brand. The worldwide distributor of Hodakas was PABATCO, for *Pacific Basin Trading Company*. Its headquarters were in the rural town of Athena, Oregon. PABATCO designed and engineered a majority of the motorcycles, and Hodaka in Japan was responsible for the engine and manufacture and assembly. Pabatco was owned by Shell Oil Company from 1965 to 1978. The name *Hodaka* comes from a mountain near the factory and means "To grow taller". The Oishi brothers, owners of Hodaka, had taken an extended trip to Europe in the late '50s and during that time they purchased close to 50 European and English motorcycles to take back to Japan to study. It is also rumoured Hodaka might have indeed designed the complete Yamaguchi SPB50, not just the engine. Hodaka was also a producer of machine tools and it has been said they borrowed the concept of one of their quick-change gear clusters in one of their metalworking lathes to construct the shift mechanism in the Hodaka gearbox, with the resulting spring-loaded shifting mechanism being patented. Using various back roads we travel through Nangkita and Yundi until we meet the Bull Creek Road. We follow the road until we get to The Greenman Inn for morning tea.

The publican at The Greenman Inn reminded me the last time we visited we were drenched by the time we arrived. Those who were in that rally will remember the excellent coffee and cake. The same will be provided again at a cost of \$10pp.


Leaving the Greenman we head towards Strathalbyn (over the hill) and skirt the edges of the town until we reach Paris Creek Road for our return journey. 
