50th Anniversary Tour

A short note about our progress with arrangements for the 50th Anniversary Tour.

- 1/ When riding motorcycles in South Australia and to be compliant with the local road traffic laws you will be required to have fitted to your machine two (2) rear view mirrors.
- 2/ Be advised that in September our weather conditions vary along with daily temperatures and could quite possibly range from anywhere between $15^{\circ} 25^{\circ}$ C. Adding to this we couldn't overlook the possibility of showers through the week.
- 3/ Saturday September 16th: You will be required to check-in at the Barossa Valley Tourist Park between the hours of 3.00 and 4.00pm. Following registration and during the early evening there is to be welcoming and get-together free sausage sizzle within the Park grounds.
- Early rise and shine on Sunday morning 17th September for a picturesque ride to Birdwood to visit the Club's Annual Motorcycle Only Swapmeet. Those choosing to ride their motorcycles will be admitted free of charge and be expected to display their pride and joy within the Club enclosure. If you wish to obtain a swapmeet site, the usual fee will apply. Sunday afternoon is free to do what you please although a ride to Melba's Chocolate Factory at Woodside is to be arranged. On the other hand you might like to visit the National Motor Museum back at Birdwood at a specially reduced entry fee.
- 5/ It is expected that each days ride will cover approximately 160Kms., with the exception of Friday September 22nd which is expected to be considerably shorter culminating within the impressive grounds of the Wolf Blass Wine Centre. Final Grand Function of the week long Tour will be the 50th Anniversary Dinner Evening on the Friday following sundown.
- 6/ If sufficient interest is shown there is to be a chartered bus made available each day to follow the riding group for a nominal fee of approximately \$10.00 per day for each passenger.
- Negotiations are at present being made to include a lunch time cruise on the River Murray departing from Mannum. Alternately, you may wish to be included an escorted visit to the Mannum Dock Museum which will include boarding the moored Paddle Steamer 'PS Marion'. For those wishing to take advantage of the on board lunch cruise a maximum sealing of 86 persons will be required to book in advance.
 - It is expected that on one other occasion a day tour of the properties used in the filming of the TV series "McLeod's Daughters" will be made available for those interested. This tour group is to meet with our bike riders at morning tea and at lunch.
- A cooked breakfast will be made available on two days together-with two evening dinner meals will also be made available. The evening meals will be separate from the final Friday evening Dinner.
- 9/ Sunday September 24th will be the usual Bay to Birdwood Run for machines and vehicles up to 1956. An entirely separate entry for this event will be necessary if you wish to participate.
