# Who are we?



### Fantastic World Mototrials Title Event.

The weekend of May 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> 2012 both Maureen and I motored to Maldon where at Mount Tdrengower just out of the town the rounds 3 and 4 of the FIM Trial World Championships were staged organized by the Trials Club of Victoria.

Setting off from Summertown we headed off for Bendigo and the McIver Highway Caravan Park. While the weather wasn't all that pleasant we arrived about 11.30pm and settled in.

Saturday morning we ventured of to Maldon. The weather once more wasn't all that inviting never-the-less appropriate mototrials conditions with suitable wet weather clothing. From the vast open car park, a lengthy walk through thick scrub to the fifteen observed sections took about ten minutes. A good mixed variety a food marquees and well-presented displays of both motor and pedal power trials machinery adorned the immediate area.

The 5 individual classes were issued with colour coded identification bibs. 1) World Pro-FIM Trial World Championship (FIM World Championship). 2) FIM Trial Open International Cup (FIM Prize). 3) FIM Junior Trial World Cup (FIM Prize). 4) FIM Youth Trial Cup 125cc (FIM Prize). The remaining class 5) FIM Trial Manufacturers World Championship (FIM World Championship).

The international World Pro field comprised of 13 competitors from Japan, Europe and Britain who would ride the special section RED splits. Riding the section BLUE splits were the FIM Open International Trial Cup group for competitors aged from 16 years upwards. The third class for riders aged 16 to 23 years, The FIM Junior Trial World Cup contingency consisted of European, British, New Zealand and Aussie guys who also rode the BLUE splits.

The final group 4) for competitors restricted to 125cc machines for the FIM Youth World Cup this award is also provided by the FIM. Class 5) is made available to FIM Trial Manufacturers World Championship (FIM World Championship). Points awarded here are attributed for the classification of the World Pro category to count for the FIM Trail Manufacturers World Championship classification.

Wet conditions made the going tough for all competitors on the Saturday amongst the huge rocky boulders throughout the course. Fifteen ginormous/monstrous sections of two laps each the likes never witnessed on Australian soil were set for the 35 strong internationals.

Spread fairly evenly throughout the approximate 2.5klm circuit in the main huge boulders to test the ability of these fearless professionals. Sections 7, 8 and 9 a short distance from the food and display marquees were the first to be approached by the huge spectator gallery estimated at between 2,500 and 3,000 strong. An abundance of familiar faces were to be recognized as followers of our local trials events.

Day 1 was easily lead home by the World number one rider in Toni Bou from Spain riding a Repsol Montesa Honda. Toni's loss for the day was 40 points to the better of the second placed rider, Adam Raga also from Spain on a GAS GAS machine.

Simply amazing were the comments from Philip at days end where 'Minders' (officially recognized assistant's to the riders) were found 'Gardening', (term used for unofficial alteration to the sections).

Gardening as we've witnessed here in Australia amounted to no more than dislodging a few unwanted rocks and kicking them away from the preferred line of travel through the section.

To witness the 'Gardening' of the top competitors 'Minders' was nothing short of amazing. I saw this guy approach the section and felt sorry for him as he appeared to be sick. I learned later from Philip that it is a done thing in Europe, if you can get away with it that is, fill ones mouth with as much water as humanly possible and spit it all out over the rocks to dispel any moss, grime or other slippery leftovers deposited from other riders. Using the sleeve of a riding jacket to wipe away similar accumulation of sediments was another often witnessed tactic. Further to this caper carried out by the Minders was seen to throw handfuls of dry sand onto a slippery surface adding to the traction factor.

Adding ever further to the responsibilities of the Minder for the wellbeing of his companion is to select the most suitable path and direct him in that direction with outstretched arm hand signals. Additional to the welfare of the competitor was as observed in hugely steep long flat rocky outcrops was to tether one's physique by long sturdy rope in an attempt to catch the riders machine if unsuccessful in his endeavours to negotiate the severe 60° plus climb for an estimated 40 meters or so with very little run up from the bottom. The power and acceleration from standing motionless of these mostly 250cc machines is phenomenal.

Day two, round 4 of the Championships was pretty much as Saturday's round 3 with Toni Bou simply far and away too superior to the rest of this world class field. Next round is in Japan the week after. Could only say a weekend of absolutely fantastic motorcycling. Brian "Nip" Kuerschner.


On arrival we were met by Roger O'Loughlin and his family and other club members greeted us and
