If you want another Tiddler Run, the southern members will organize one on 19th of August around the McLaren Vale area followed by BBQ lunch.





Immediately after the Annual General Meeting in 1925, Mr. F. W. Vasey tendered his resignation as Chairman, on account of ill-health. Mr. E. H. McMichael was elected to the vacancy, but in March, 1926, found it necessary to resign owing to pressure of private business. The Association was fortunate in securing the services of Mr. P. J. A. Lawrence, who has devoted a great deal of time and energy to this work. The Committee wishes to place on record its appreciation of the services rendered by these gentlemen.

Obituary.

It is with deepest regret that the Committee records the death of Mr. Frederick William Vasey, which occurred on August 21, 1926. For six years Mr. Vasey had been one of the most active and enthusiastic members of the Committee, and had served four years as Chairman. During his term of office the membership had increased from under 2,000 to nearly 10,000 and motorists in South Australia owe a heavy debt of gratitude to him. The Committee desires to record its appreciation of his work and extends deepest sympathy to his family.

All British day—Sunday 12th February 2012.

Sunday morning was a bit cold, but several members braved the crisp morning air and ventured to high country of Summertown and Uraidla. We gathered outside Brian's (Nipper's) place to collect our early passes into the oval. We had arrived about 8am by car and motorcycles. Riders like Peter Johnson and Paul Whahlstedt bitterly complained about the cold air of Summertown, those of us in the cars felt

nothing. Little did they know that those who braved the morn in shorts were very comfortable later on when the heat settled on us.

We then ventured off and entered Uraidla oval and went straight to our allocated site and began the exercise of tent building, display settings, motorcycle manoeuvring and raising 4 flags with three (3) club banners.

We had officially 13 motorcycle entered, but at the end of the day there were 11 gleaming and not so gleaming examples on display.

The ride have been organised by Ron Truscott, Rob Smyth will lead both rides at a leisurely pace?




The year has proved a strenuous one for this department, but the service has been very greatly appreciated by those members who have been fortunate (or unfortunate) enough to utilise it. During the year 1,113 members were afforded free legal defence, and 121 members were given free legal advice. The solicitors report that they have appeared, not only at the Traffic Court, but at every Magistrates' Court in the metropolitan area. This service has proved of very great advantage to country members. In the majority of cases members pleaded guilty, but a number of cases were fought. In most instances the charges were either dismissed or a conviction without penalty recorded. At one period during the year, a large number of members were charged with alleged traffic offences, and no complaint was served until three or four months after the alleged offence. The solicitors took strong objections, when the cases came on for hearing, to the unfair and unreasonable delay, and in each case the Magistrate recorded a conviction without a penalty. A case of outstanding importance was the arrest of Guide Nicholas on a charge of loitering when he was on duty at the trap in King William Street near the General Post Office. The case was successfully defended, and the charge dismissed against the police. A subsequent action for damages for wrongful arrest was successful.


The Association, in furtherance of its general policy, has also prosecuted several offenders for driving to the danger of the public, and has been successful in getting heavy fines inflicted.

Many letters of appreciation have been received of the service rendered by the solicitors, both in the capacity of acting for members in Court, and advising them in the many and multifarious difficulties and disputes which have arisen from time to time as the result of collisions, purchase of motor vehicles, &c.

Police Activities.—The Traffic Police have been most active during the year, but the Committee contends that they have been following an entirely wrong system. Instead of the police helping motorists and controlling the traffic, their object appears to be the piling up of convictions. Motorists generally are convinced that under the present system the reckless or dangerous driver is rarely caught, and an analysis of the Traffic Court prosecutions proves this. The motorist slightly exceeding the limit, and in the vast majority of cases without danger to the public, is almost invariably the one who appears before the Court.

The Committee is strongly of the opinion that if the police were in uniform they would have a better control of traffic, as they would be more readily recognised and motorists would conform to the law. Constables on beat duty are in uniform for a very obvious reason, and it is therefore logical that traffic police, whose duty it is to control and facilitate traffic, should be in uniform also. Ladies driving alone at night should be able to determine whether they are really accosted by the police when they are ordered to stop by two men in cycle and sidecar. Representations have been made that the police should be in uniform. It has also been pointed out that prevention of infraction of the law is the best form of police work.
