

RALLY REPORT: TIDDLERS' RUN-25th August .

After three weeks of almost constant rain the chance of a good day on the 25th of August seemed fairly remote. However, late in the week the forecast shifted from "showers" to "cloudy" and we once again managed clear skies for one of our southern runs.

We met at Oxenberry Winery in McLaren Vale and after the customary briefing and photo shoot, we set off to Blewitt Springs along the back roads passing the sandy soil vineyards found in that area of McLaren Vale. A loop back to Kangarilla Road followed by a run down the McMurtrie Mile saw us gather in the carpark of the Alma Hotel in Willunga for a regroup. Ian Baldock was kindly driving the back-up vehicle (thanks Ian!) but had been delayed by some machines which needed a little roadside assistance so our stay at Willunga was slightly extended.

We set off again, up through the "tunnel" underneath the

freeway and down Colville Road. This was once the premier almond strip in the district and despite our run being in the middle of the almond blossom season only a few small orchards could be found. Vineyards now occupy almost every property. We turned back onto the main road and followed it to Aldinga where the local bakery (having been alerted that we were coming) served great coffee and cakes to the hungry riders. Les Carter enjoyed a seafood pie and while the concept of prawns and calamari in a meat pie turned most of us green he enjoyed it enough to go back for seconds with a pastie!

We travelled back to McLaren Vale along the coast road from Port Willunga and cross country via the minor roads behind the Vale. By the time we reached Oxenberry Jim and Darryl had the barbeque ready and a queue for the sausage sizzle formed very quickly! Thanks to Jim who once again missed out on the ride to cook our lunch. The total run was about 65 kilometres.

It's great to see increasing numbers of small bikes coming out on these runs. I especially liked the two James Comet and the swingarm James. Together with Brian's autocycle and the C10s, C11s, Jane Clarke's amazing D1 Bantam and other lightweights it certainly made for a real "Tiddler Run". Thanks must also go to Leon and others for bringing out the veteran and vintage machines - we are fortunate indeed to see machinery like this on our club runs and I, for one, appreciate the effort that is required to prepare and ride the machines.

Finally, thanks to Michael Scarpantoni once again for the use of his great venue and especially his kind donation of wine at lunch time. I heard more than one favourable comment about the wine - especially that Oxenberry Cabernet Shiraz!

A great day out, one to be remembered.

I'd expect most Club Members would have heard of the song by the 'Eagles' **'Life in the Fast Lane'**. Well, I'd like to convey a brief analysis of my most recent experience of **'Life in the Slow Lane'** on the recent 'Tiddlers Run' on the weekend of 25th August last.

Having obtained the necessary one day permit for the outing on my little Excelsior Autobyk I looked very much forward to joining other Club Members at 9.30 in the car park of the Scarpantoni families Oxenberry Winery. I was very excited when the day's weather forecast was for fine if not coolish riding conditions. My usual mount, the 500 AJS 'Compy' was I expect quite disheartened with being left at home in the garage for my preference for the days outing, more than likely seriously sulking. To convince the AJ it was however a 'Tiddlers Run' took some convincing.

I gave myself a good hour and a half for the journey from Summertown with ample time to spare on my arrival at McLaren Vale to be met by one of our hosts for the day, Tony Morrisset and two others. I amongst several other Members had yet to complete the day's entry form. At roll call it was heartening to see a huge number assembled, Dean Govan later admitted to counting in excess of forty machines parked up for Jimmy's 'Sausage Sizzle' lunch. All manner of machines and owners took advantage of this most popular outing from solid big Vee Twins, early and later models to perhaps my out and out 98cc pedal assist Tiddler.

However, once out on the road our morning run took us back toward McLaren Flat turning left just short in the direction of Blewett Springs. Cruising along I'd imagine at a comfortable average, I'm guessing 30kph well within sight of Leon Mitchell and David Radloff on their veterans. The Excelsior suddenly decided to bring to a halt my enjoyment. Carrying no tools with me, decided to wait for Ian Baldock and the 'Backup Trailer' suspecting a 'whiskered plug'.

At our first regroup at Willunga, Bob Gill had his tool roll out seeking a loss of spark on his Veteran machine. Once removed it was no trouble to fire up the 98cc 'Spryte' engine and be on our way to Aldinga

Heading back to McLaren Vale along the Main South Road for me was quite daunting with the passing traffic buzzing by at the usual 100 clicks and me pedalling like crazy up a couple of steep slopes before turning right in the direction of our lunch break terminating a somewhat enthralling 60km journey. Was I happy with my \$57 one day permit outing, you betcha. Not so sure about any further 'Tiddlers Runs' though. It can be quite scary at 30kph with passing traffic buzzing by at in some cases 100 plus kph. I did however enjoy myself and Jimmy and the crew can be well satisfied and congratulated for their hospitality for this much admired event down south. *Nipper*.

RIDERS who desire a lively sports machine will find their requirements met in the "Silver Streak" range, which includes models of 250, 350 and 500 c.c. The 350 c.c. model may be taken as typical, and its price is very reasonable having regard to the specification. A feature is the obvious thought which has been given to the choice of gear ratios, the sporting rider's ideal of three fairly close gears with a very low first having been arranged.

Another interesting model is the overhead-camshaft racing replica, the engine of which has been brought into line with the 1938 T.T. models. It has the special foot-change and the new handlebar shape. Also fitted is an 8in. front brake with the T.T. type of drum and anchorage.



Although the 990 c.c. side-valve twin has not been altered appreciably, certain details have received attention, and the model is even more suitable for use with a heavy sidecar.

In view of the desirability of extending overseas trade, a special "export" specification is available.

All except the cheapest models in the range are provided with pillion footrest lugs to take the A.J.S. rests supplied as an extra. Likewise, there is a new integral speedometer mounting on the top of the forks, while another extra (applicable to all models) is a folding propstand.

Less noticeable improvements are embodied in the silencer fixing attachments, and in the incorporation in the brakes of hardened wearing plates to take the pressure of the expander mechanism. Engine developments have varied according to the type involved, although the complete enclosure of the valve gear is common to all. The 250 c.c. engines have somewhat modified inlet ports in the interests of both slow running and acceleration, while sturder gear boxes and heavier fork springs are fitted to the 250 c.c. and 350 c.c. models.

Sadly, Doug never quite got the machine running before his passing, and I often pondered its future.


Sometime later, I was contacted by the family, saying "Dad wanted you to have the "P", so I was able to purchase the machine.
