

After this date your historic registration is no longer valid if these requirements haven't been complied with.

It is the members responsibility to arrange and take the vehicle for inspection to the Club approved person, and to NOT have them come to you.



Starting off at the top of the hill at about 35 Kph with throttle closed, I started down the hill and held the same speed for a while and then caught up with an old car (Ford T I think) also going down slower than I was, and so I had to swerved out in front of Lew Dowsett (sorry Lew) sounding my warning device as I passed it. I finish up doing 47 Kph as I came into Willunga with-



out using the brakes at all, which pleased me greatly, and then onto McLaren Vale and the Winery. Michael had said at the briefing that we could park on his new concrete behind the fence, so I would say there may be some oil spots left on it while we all enjoyed a fine Lunch of Bread, Sausages and Onions and soft drink or water and I noticed some enjoyed some of Michael's fine wines. One of our members who rode his BSA on the run had a little drive to get home after the run to get home to Renmark and go on the Superway over Grand Junction Road for the first time. Tiddler Run. Sunday 24th August 2014.

The annual Tiddler Run in McLaren Vale has been gaining popularity each year and it was great to see the combination of excellent weather, an interesting rally route and a sausage sizzle really brought out a large number of bikes.

Machines started arriving at Oxenberry Winery just after nine on Sunday morning and shortly before the rally started we counted over fifty bikes - a mix of veteran and vintage bikes as well as a good proportion of classics and moderns. While the number of "tiddlers" isn't high it was great to see two Tilbrook s, a James and three BSA C11s including Kevin Heritage's little beeza down from Paringa on its first time out. There were some outstanding machines - too many to mention - but new club member Bill Turner's ex-LAPD Moto Guzzi Californian gathered a crowd wherever it was parked.

After the customary roll call and photo the rally set off out towards McLaren Flat. Led by Mick Clarke on the M21, we turned towards Blewitt Springs and looped back via Kays Winery and Chapel Hill to follow the Onkaparinga Valley escarpment road all the way to Kangarilla. This is one of the great riding roads of the south and wound through twenty kilometres of vineyard and national park scenery. From Kangarilla we followed the winding Dashwood Gully Road to Meadows where the bikes parked outside the "Balance for Body, Mind and Soul" Cafe and we enjoyed coffee and cake.

Bay to Birdwood Promotion on Channel 9

Belinda Petersen the Marketing Manager for the Bay to Birdwood Run on September 28th gave me a ring on 29-7-2014 to ask whether I could take my Harley Davidson to West Beach Shores on Monday Night 4 -8-2014 for use as back drop for Virginia Langeberg while she does the Weather Report at 5.30 6.30 and 7.00 pm. In previous years only cars had been used but due to bike numbers down this year they had decided to have a bike as well as the two cars. I mentioned that I also had a 1953 AJS that was also entered, would they like me to bring that as well, if it is no problem "yes please". On the Sunday I got the Bikes down and gave them a quick clean and set the trailer up with the Bike Rails. Monday Afternoon I started to load the Harley Davidson when a guy driving pass asked if he could take a photo and asked about the bike. Belinda rang to check that I would be bringing the Harley down to West Beach and she would see me there. While I was loading the AJS I had a lady walking pass ask about the bikes. Belinda rang again to tell me Channel 9 had changed the schedule and I only need to get to West Beach at 6.00 pm rather than 5.00 pm and only 7.00 pm slot to be used due to the cold weather. I arrived just before 6.00pm at West Beach where the Bay To Birdwood normally starts. Are you thinking of buying a classic motorcycle?

Before you take the plunge, consider the advice of our Real Classic riders - folks who have been there, done that, spent a fortune and survived the wrath of The Better Half... (from Real Classic Magazine UK)

If You Buy A Bike In Bits, make sure you have boxes and boxes of the correct nuts and bolts, especially the special fasteners that hold the engine, gearbox, suspension and frame together.

Do You Want To Ride it, or to spend more time showing it?

The Best Condition example always works out to be the cheapest in the long term.

Ignore Marque Snobs and armchair experts. **A Big Single** is perfect for chuffing around the lanes at 50ish.

A Late Triumph/BSA or early Jap four is great for tearing along in reasonable safety at speed.

Suss Out Spares availability cos it's no use buying that Caledonia Purple Majestic if everything has to be made especially.

Learn The Art of riding without brakes and invest in aright leg strengthened!

Buy The First Bike you fancy - it'll be a dog anyway, so get it over with.

Buy Another Bike To Use whilst the first is being fixed.

Buy a BSA B25! Cheap, easy to work on, surprisingly nice when running well. The MOST underrated bike? Probably.

Make Contact/Join A Club of a marque that takes your fancy. This gives you the best exposure good advice and probably also the best sources of machines to purchase. Follow your heart, because that is what keeps you spannering and riding - not good sense!

Be Ready To Walk Up to complete strangers, and see how they turn into your best mates.

Buy The Best You Can Afford, preferably with some sort of comeback when it goes pop on the way home. A modern Enfield would be a good starting point Never heard of it ? Well, it's the most popular motorcycle mod of the year, which is only half way through... I wonder about the efficiency's of the "'quick release passenger seat" is this while the passenger is seated on it or once you decide to be single and go it alone? Still I suppose the offer of the tools that come with it are a bonus.

Don't Buy if you haven't heard it running.

Get Someone who knows a bit about that particular machine to check it out with you and get the same bloke to ride it if possible. **Check** that there are no complications with registration VIN or such like. If you're really, really taken with it, then forget all the above and buy it anyway!

Ignore Anyone who tells you not to buy a Triumph/BSA triple - they're wonderful! But be prepared to seek advice on maintenance.

Buy What You Want and ignore everyone else's opinions. You're going to ride it (not them); you're going to fix it (not them)

Buy A Big Toolbox for all the tools you will need

Enjoy It For What It Is, not what it should be. I fyou buy the top of the range sporting model of yesteryear then be aware that these were often at the limits of engineering reliability. That's why the higher mileage chaps tend to go for the lower-down-the range models.

Do Not under any circumstances buy a Ducati single. They are like a combined heroin and crack cocaine habit: highly addictive and expensive to maintain.

Ride More Than One example of your chosen model first. The older they are then the more examples you should ride - no two old bikes are the same.

Buy A Bike that is ridden regularly by the person you are buying it from. <u>Editor</u>—*not sure the source of this information/report.*

It was by chance that I met with John Rose and his sister Pam Crowhust (nee Rose) when they reminisced about their early days of riding motorcycles in the Victor Harbor area.

It was in early 1946 or thereabouts, just after WW2 (memory fading here), John and Pam remembered when they young teenagers with a passion for motorcycles, would gather outside Bells store 43 Ocean Street, Victor Harbor, commonly known as 'Bells Corner' with many others local lads and their sisters on their motorcycles to socialize and chat.

Bells Store is the corner of Coral and Ocean Streets Victor Harbor. It was the first general store that was opened on this site in 1865, by 1894 David Bell became the owner and for many years it was both a grocery and drapery store.

There were brothers, sisters and girlfriends in this group so you could say it was a family affair. Some held the appropriate motorcycle licence others probable were too young to get one, but still they would ride what ever motorcycle they could afford to purchases.

The group consisted of John, Henry and sister Pam Rose along with Dean, Roger and Kevin Tugwell, Harold, Clary and Ivy Baum, Denis Castle, Jeff and sister Shirley Schultz, Ralph Hughes. brothers Jim, Dean, Les, Brian and Harold Crowhurst. Ron Duncan, and Norm Hartwick who were a part of this group. Some met and married their future husband or wives, such was the closeness of the group.

John said they were keen to form a motorcycle club and so decided to call themselves 'South Coast Motorcycle Club'. They were never affiliated with any official club because Adelaide was too far away so the idea of a local club was a good idea at the time.

The girls cut our pieces of purple/magenta coloured woollen cloth in the shape of a wheel with wings, then with gold thread hand stitched the cloth showing the outline of a wheel and wings and this was then sewn on their jackets or jumpers.

Pam remembers being taught how to ride an Ariel motorcycle by Bob Murfitt who she liked at the time and rode Bob's ride bike regularly but later married Les Crowhurst.

The discussions would involve where they would ride for that day? Would it be a hill climb in the sand hills at Chiton Rocks, or a general ride to a friends place? What ever was the decision, they would head off at speed along the rough and dusty roads. There was no mention of the local Police who usually rode Ariel outfits paying attention to them.

To them, just to have enough money to purchase a motorcycle was a luxury, costing five pounds for an old average machine or a bit more for a faster bike. The fast machines brought speed and crashes, usually the motorcycld was beyond repair and a new one purchased.

One of the member's father owned a garage and it was not uncommon for some member's motorcycles to be found there being repaired and serviced.




commitments broke up the formality of the club. But they would occasionally meet and ride their bikes together. Now days most members are in their 70' and 80's and some deceased, so it is only fading memory of these wild days, but the photos retained bring back memories.

Pat Crowhurst said, 'They were wonderful days, we had a great time and social life, often rode as far afield as Strathalbyn. We have fading memories, but the photos help us to remember those carefree days'.

VVMCCSA proposed changes to the current Club's Constitution. <u>The Secretary,</u> <u>The Veteran & Vintage Motor Cycle Club.</u>

Pursuant to the provisions of Clause 16 of the Constitution. We the undersigned members propose these amendments to the Clubs Constitution. Clause 6. Remove the words "\$6.00 or any" from Sub Clause a. Remove the words "\$10.00 or" from Sub Clause b. Alter the number "3 I to "2" in Sub Clause d. Clause 7. Delete completely Sub Clause a. Renumber Subclause "b' as Sub Clause "a" Renumber Sub Clause "c" as Sub Clause "b". Clause 9. Sub Clause a Remove the word FINANCIAL appearing after the figure4. Sub Clause b. Delete the word "CONTROL" and replace it with the word "MANAGE". Clause 11. Sub Clause b. Remove the worth FINANCIAL appearing after the word the. Clause 12. Sub Clause b. Remove the word FINANCIAL appearing after the word the. Clause 16. Remove the FINANCIAL appearing after the word five and after the word all. Clause 17. Remove the word FINANCIAL appearing after the word the. Clause 19. Remove the amount of \$50.00 appearing after the word exceeding and Replace with the amount \$100.00. Clause 22. Sub Clause c. Remove the word FINANCIAL appearing after the figure 5. Sub Clause g. Remove the word FINANCIAL appearing after the word of. Clause 23. Remove the word FINANCIAL appearing after the word meetings. Clause 27. Add after the word "direct" in the first sentence a further sentence. "At the conclusion of purpose that sub-committee automatically ceases". The purpose of these amendments is to bring it up to date and define when sub committees duties cease to exist. The removal of the word FINANCIAL is because it is not necessary, a person is either a member or they are not, if a person has paid a subscription then he/she is a member if not paid pursuant to Clause6 [dJ membership ceases.

Spare a thought for your motorcycle rider compatriots in North Korea. It is illegal and too expensive to buy a car, so most people save hard to buy a motorcycle.

However, because of oil shortages, the North Korean government has restricted the use of private motorcycles to the morning rush hours and from 8 to 10pm. Offenders face having their bike confiscated. The new regulations do not apply to motorcycles for official use. Fuel is rationed in the North Korea, but only 6.8% of

families get fuel rations. Half the population buys fuel through "unofficial" channels. Motorcycle riders are hopeful the nene regulations will be temporary, but expect to able to use their bikes for work and other errands by offering bribes. That seems to be how the country works.



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North East ride 21st September


Depart Pelican Plaza at 9.30, head for Gumeracha via One Tree Hill, Kersbrook and Chain Of Ponds.

Finish ride at the recreation ground.

Total distance—40kms & 75 kms.
