New helmet laws

Road Safety Minister Peter Malinauskas has announced that European ECE 22.05 standard helmets are now legal to be worn by motorcyclists in South Australia.

United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (ECE) 22.05 was developed from an in depth study of head injuries to motorcycle riders and is used in Europe and many other countries around the world.

The Road Traffic (Miscellaneous) Regulations 2014 have also been updated to remove outdated British Standards and Japanese helmet models all pre-dating 1988.

Provisions allowing a bicycle helmet to be used by a motorcycle passenger under the age of six years have also been removed.

Background

These changes mean that helmets worn by motorcyclists in South Australia must meet any of three standards and bear a relevant certification mark:

- □ Australian Standard 1698-1988 Protective helmets for vehicle users (AS1698-1988); or
- □ <u>Australian/ New Zealand Standard 1698:2006</u> *Protective helmets for vehicle users* (AS/NZS 1698:2006); or
- □ <u>United Nations Economic Commission for Europe Regulation No 22</u> Uniform provisions concerning the approval of protective helmets and their visors for drivers and passengers of motor cycles and mopeds, incorporating the 05 series of amendments, (ECE 22.05)

These helmet standards are approved for use in the majority of states and territories.

Archie Limb: A Port Pirie pioneer. By Matt Carcich of the Recorder, Port Pirie.

Archibald 'Archie' Limb was a master of machinery and it can now be revealed he built one of the first motor-cycles that was entirely built in Port Pirie in 1903. This was all done in Limb's business 'Port Pirie Pioneer Cycle and Motor Cycling Works' which he purchased from Mr. T. Row in 1898 in partnership with Arnold Low in the early years and is also believed to have worked with a Mr. Alf Williams later on.

Limb wasn't the only one as at least three brands were made – the Limb, the Laver and the Growden. Limb earned a good reputation by reading respective literature of his field to keep his skills up to date and had the latest machinery available. Within a decade his business sold and did maintenance work on bicycles such as 'American Path Racers' which were used for road and race use.

However his desire to enter the motorbike market was strong. With assistance from Veteran and Vintage Motorcycle Club of South Australia President Brian Forth, this move was confirmed from the book 'A-Z Australian Motorcycles' which was published by Rob Seward in 1996.

A glimpse into the life of Archie Limb.

"The PIRIE, built by Arch Limb...ran a cycle building business in partnership with a Mr Low (at least in the early years) at Port Pirie, S.A., from about 1903 until 1914. In 1903 he built a motor bicycle with clip-on Minerva engine, reputed to be the first motorcycle in Port Pirie."

And in a funny quirk the business was located next to the local paper, *The Recorder*. Minerva engines were Belgium 'clip on engines' that helped simplify the transformation from a bicycle to a motorcycle

Limb tested his new motorcycle with a trip to Warnertown and back. It was reported at the time to be a ride covered with more noise than speed. Mr. Limb was born on June 4, 1862 and according to data from the Australian Bureau of Statistics, at the age of 29 his life expectancy was 43 but he defied that to pass away at 87. His expertise wasn't limited to two wheels. On October 15, 1910, Limb delivered an order of a a Swiss based 'Martini Motor Car' to Dr. Hampden Carr. Martini was a Swiss car-maker that was famous at the time for cars with engines built in the rear, an uncommon sight at the time. It was a 16 horsepower vehicle with the chassis built in Switzerland and the body and mountings were built in Adelaide under Mr. Limb's supervision. https://www.portpirierecorder.com.au/story/3883723/archie-limb-a-port-pirie-pioneer/

Good to talk with you and i am delighted that someone is at last going to do a piece on Arch limb. As discussed there was quite a thriving motorcycle industry in the pioneering years (say 1902-10) in Port Pirie and I am aware that at least three brands were made there namely the Limb, the Laver and the Growden. There is also one Limb motorcycle still existing a Fafnir engined model of about 1906 and the remains of a Growden are also slowly being restored locally.

At that time motorcycles were pretty primitive (no gearbox or clutch) and it was often the case that the local cycle shop ordered the engine and a kit of frame lugs and front forks from a city wholesaler such as James Hill and Co or JN Taylor and then proceeded to braze up the frame just as he did a bicycle. Hence a lot of cycle builders built the first local motorcycles.

I am just coming to the end of an epic house and shed rebuilding project but have photos of Growdens and also a Laver motorcycle all fitted with Belgian made Minerva engines but as I said I will just need a little bit of time to get it all together for you.

In the meantime if you could let me have the link to the article containing the reminiscences of Arch Limb that would be good.

MOTOR BIKE ON FIRE.

motor bicycle belonging to Mr. R. J. Flett caught alight in the premis es of Mr. A. Limb, in Ellen Street, at about half-past elsven on Saturday morning. The machine had been left there for repairs. These had just completed and Mr. Ted Limb was testing the machine, when suddenly flames were seen just above the engine. The tires and rubber tubing about the bike caught before the blaze could be extinguished, and then the pump and grips, which were cel-luloid and burnt fiercely, ignited. The flames shot some feet into the air, almost licking the rafters of the roof, and there was imminent danger the petrol tank exploding and scattering the fire all over the building. Mr. Limb, jun's., first thoughts were or a bag with which to emother the outbreak, but unfortunately there was none handy. In the Recoroffice adjoining there is a tap, and buckets of water were handed through a window in the dividing wall and by that means the flames, were extinguished. It is on record that the first motor cycle built entirely in Pirie was the work of the late Archie Limb, father of Teddy Limb, who was in partnership here for years with the late Alf. Williams.

Archie Limb, pastmaster in the art of building cycles, turned out a machine in his workshop more than 40 years ago, and a thrilled crowd of cyclists followed its progress to Warnertown and back the route covered with more noise than speed.

PIRIE. built by Arch Limb had a cycle building business in partnership with a Mr Low (at least in the early s) at Port Pirie, S.A., from about 1903 until 1914. In 1903 he built a motor bicycle with clip-on Minerva engine, ited to be the first motorcycle in Port Pirie.

DWDEN - George Growden assembled approximately ten Minerva engined motorcycles at Port Pirie, S.A., cycle p in the years 1904-07. He then moved to Hawker . His interest in motorcycles started when he bought one of first imported by J.N. Taylor in Adelaide; the Growden machines were assembled using Minerva kit parts chased from Taylor's.



Rein Gerritsen made wrong turn in Echunga and had to be found and returned to the pack.


