



I had ndenser replaced first off, but sparks got weak again when it got hot. cond repairer still could not find a fault so I got him to rewire the armae and after assembly it was discovered that spark was stronger at full ard than at full advance. Points opening was changed to correct this blem so now was the test. Started within 2 kicks and rode to Meadows ere I found circlip holding Kick starter shaft in place had broken and aled shaft to start move out. Open up toolbox and run a wire around shaft hold it in place. After a Orange juice and pasty we start riding back to e start. Approaching McLaren Vale the motor cut out like someone switch the Ignition switch which I do not have, plenty of fuel left, then noticed It Air valve on end of Carburettor was not there. went for a walk back vn the road to find the air-valve and screwed it back on the bike and d back to Oxenberry. I had not tightened it enough when I took it off to en toolbox at Meadows. Magneto still working fine although not as hot as as hoping with the timing not quite right at present as the bike is not as t as it used to be. Talking to club members have told me how to correct timing so we appear to be heading in the right direction at last. 



HOLDEN

Colonel Sir Henry Capel Holden was one of the great characters of motorcycling's pioneering years. He designed the world's first four-cylinder motorbike, a 1054cc watercooled, flat-four that was built in Coventry between 1899 and 1902. The four-stroke engine produced 3bhp, giving the bicycle-style Holden a top speed of about 25mph (40kph). Colonel Holden went on to design Brooklands, the world's first purposebuilt race circuit, in 1906.



Australian Motorcycle Jamboree.

Australia once had a thriving manufacturing industry which included both motorcycles and sidecars and the inaugural Australian Motorcycle Jamboree is to be held <u>24th September 2016 at Moseley Square Glenelg</u> by the Veteran and Vintage Motorcycle Club of SA to celebrate that history.

It will take the form of a display of Australian made motorcycles and sidecars and SA made bicycles will not be turned away. We are looking to have Bullock, Lewis, Elliott Payneham and other lesser known brands representing the South Australian manufacturers from the early period up to 1930 as well as some interstate brands. From the middle period it is hoped that Waratahs, Acmes and Malvern Star autocycles will leave a blue haze down Jetty Road if their owners ride them to the event. Finally from the post war period it is hoped that there will be the biggest gathering of Tilbrook motorcycles since they left the factory at Kensington in the 1950s.

It is hoped that Goulding sidecars from the 20s will be there along with Dusting and the later Tilbrook sidecar outfits from the post war period.

motorcycles and sidecars together in the one spot to celebrate a significant part of Australian manufacturing history. 








An Elliott Villiers of about 1922, with Sturmey Archer 2-speed gear, Druid fork and Walker frame components



MODERN SPRING FORKS.

Notes on the Ways and Means Adopted by Twenty-seven Makers to Absorb Front Wheel Shock.

BEARDMORE.

TO approviate even faintly what the spring fork does for us, one must imagine doing without. The rigid frame machine is a quite practical and very popular proposition; but the rigid fork on the mechanically propelled twowheeler is extinct.

Had the idea of a spring fork never arisen, had the idea never developed into something workable, reliable, and efficient, then the motor cycle, as we know it to day, might be non-existent.

Desirable Qualities

Good-as present-day forks are, a wide divergence in design and method in attaining the one end seems to indicate that finality has not been reached. Probably not; but it must be remembered that even the best types are based on a compromise and, unfortunately, a compromise between more than merely two factors. Comfort, ease of steering (under which must be included steadiness at all conditions), reliability (immunity -from danger of sudden breakages), and durability (that is, maintenance of efficiency, and particularly lateral stability). all must be studied in the evolution of a front wheel springing system. It is but natural, therefore, that designers should struggle to these SUNBEAM. ideals by widely differing parts.

Our present purpose is to explain and analyse the various methods employed to day to trap as far as possible front wheel "far" before it reaches the machine and the rider.

Forks may be nest readily and intelligibly classified into five general categories, by considering the morement or motion they permit of the wheel (or wheel spindle) when in action. Tabulated, these five types are :

 (ii) Vertical or slightly inclined straight line movement.

(2.) (a) Short radial movement in *ternt* of a low down pivor, or (b) short radial movement *behind* a low pivor.

(3.) "To and fro" radial movement on a pixet at the foot of the **ROYAL RUBY** steering head.

(4.) Upward (or vertical) curving

motion obtained by two " parallel links " (modified in some cases by being neither parallel nor of equal length).

(5.) Approximately a combinition of 3 and 4, obtained by substituting some form of spring for the top pair of links. Class i despite the fact that it lends itself admitably to enclosed shock and rebound springs, and to a strong and near construction, has but three adherents—Coulson, Scott, and Wooler. Suspending the wheel on shore radius rods (Class 2) formed one of rise earliest methods, and it still udids good on at least seven machines--Chater-Lea, Corrowa, F.N., Harley Davidson, Indian, L.M.C., and P. and M. Excepting the Indian; then wheels all describe an are in from of the pivot, and here again the actual springing is very varied. An extension of the preat parwards on the L.M.C. simply pulls against two coll springs -a very simple but flexible construction. On the Corona a similar extennion, but at right angles, converts a "vertical" notement to a hori-sontial motion checked by enclosed springs. Both the F.N. and the Harley make use of diples vertical stays committing coil springs-in the lidter separate springs are used for slock and relation. The Chater Lea favours the samplicity of two sturdy unenclosed coil springs mounted above the duplex girder, while the P. and M. uses a pair of naked tension springs for shock stresses and a central enclosed cold for rebound. Doubled-back laminated springs reaching out from the steering head efficiently damp both these movements on the Indian. It is nearworthy that both the well known American machines make use of the -but pivot system.

No Vertical Movement.

Only two focks of the types illustrated come into Class. 5, by using the clean-looking and almost wessproof action so long embodied on the Trininght. The other, of course, is the Beardmore, which, however, embodies two limitated springs set at right angles in contradistingtion to the single short coil, or more resenenclosed shork and reliand, bufferon the Trinninh.

trains club and/or Goode's Car Restoration workshop in Clare. Distance 57 kms.


