<u>Classic at Harts.</u>

Saturday 15th and Sunday 16th, Lew Hyleton and other members of the Classic owners club organised and assemble a large gathering of veteran, vintage and classic motorcycles to be displayed in the complex of Heart's Mill in Port Adelaide covering 100 years of motorcycling.

On talking to Lew, "he said at first members of his own club doubted if he could get around 50 motorcycles for the display and it would be an embarrassment to the Classic Owners MC". Firstly he had find many volunteers to assist him with this project, and then over many months of advertising and negotiating with various interested parties to entice them to display motorcycles at this extravaganza.

About 153 motorcycles were promised and delivered to the mill, the oldest were 1902 Columbia motorcycles thru to 1990's.

Finally, on Friday 15th the first of many motorcycle began to arrive at the mill where volunteers were seen writing up information flyers for each motorcycle, assisting the movement of motorcycle into the building and placed roughly into their numerical years.

Lew said, "All day Friday and into the evening there was a mad scramble to place every motorcycle in year build order, erect the bunting and then finally sit back waiting for the big day to come'.



Many members of VVMCCSA namely Paul Knapp, Leon Mitchell, Brian Kuerschner, Robert Gill, Terry Rowe, Peter Arriola, Robert Elliot, Brian Forth, David Holbrook, Bruce Colwell and Ray Collins supplied motorcycles.

The state <u>Minister of Transports Stephen Mulligan</u> and <u>Enfield/Port Adelaide Mayor Garry Johansson</u> opened the exhibition, then Lew gave them a guided tour of the display which was well appreciated by the exhibitors.

We realize it was a daunting exercise and the number of motorcycle on display and the numbers of the public who visited the display indicated that the exercise was worth every bit of heartache and stress it gave you and your team.









National Veteran Motor Cycle Rally 2017-Barossa Valley, South Australia.

Sunday 17 September - Friday 22 September 2017

The Veteran and Vintage Motor Cycle Club of South Australia is hosting the National Veteran Motor Cycle Rally in September 2017. The rally is a non-competitive event on open South Australian roads for motor cycles and tri-cars built before 31 December 1918. Veteran enthusiasts from clubs all around Australia are invited to join us for the event. The organisers would be especially interested to hear from international enthusiasts who may wish to join us.

When-Sunday 17th to Friday 22nd September 2017.

Where-Based at the Barossa Tourist Park, Nuriootpa, in the heart of the Barossa Valley SA.

Rally Format—Interesting, quiet, undulating roads and great scenery. We have preliminary run details, which incorporate a maximum of 30 km between stops, a morning tea break each day, and total daily distances of 100km or, on one day, just a little over.

<u>Attractions</u>- Let's start with 100+ interesting veteran motorcycles, 100+ interesting veteran enthusiasts, and six days of riding on beautiful, quiet country roads.
