The new proposed Government Legislation will mean big changes to the procedures and administration of Historic Rego within the clubs. The effect of these changes were discussed at great length. The fine detail is unknown at this stage.

Historic cars: from garage to road

Classic car lovers restricted by rego laws may soon be able to enjoy their hobby on the road.

Currently, historic car owners can access a special conditional registration that allows them to drive on public roads for up to 90 days a year. However, to do so, the vehicles aren't allowed to be modified from their original design, stopping thousands from taking their vehicles to the streets.

Even slight changes, such as adding a CD player or air conditioner – or even making safety improvements, like installing a better braking system – can prevent enthusiasts from using the scheme.

The proposed changes, which would also cover historic lefthand drive vehicles and street rods – may start from 1 July this year and include:

- flexibility to improve the ride, handling and safety of the vehicle, as well as cosmetic enhancements;
- moving from a fixed cut-off manufacture date of 1979 to a rolling 30-year vehicle age;
- removing requirements for motoring club vehicle inspections; and
- reducing limitations banning left-hand drive vehicles with safety improvements.

All British day - Sunday 12th February 2017.

Sunday arrived as a cool and pleasant day, far from the searing heat we had experience in the days leading to this weekend. The drive thru the hills to the annual 'All British Day' event at Echunga Oval was a pleasant relief.

We had had a weird week of temperatures in the high 30's to the low 40's and one was wondering if the temperature would ease for Sunday which was classified a typical British day with a cloudy sky, cool breeze and the odd drop of rain which never eventuated.

Slowly approximately 21 members of the VVMCCSA gathered in our allotted patch of green turn in the middle of the oval grounds bordered by the BSA Owners, Norton Owners and Triumph Riders of SA all camped happily together with the BSA A65 the feature motorcycle the main attraction.

Of the 21 entries in the book I counted 19 motorcycle on display. Those who attended were—Steve Cramp-1973 Triumph Hurricane (*winner of the best motorcycle*; Dean Govan-1936 Panther; Paul

Walhstedt-1948 Matchless; JP Maloney 1950 Matchless; Dominic Brown-1969 Velocette; John Keay-1956 Matchless; Wayne Lawson-BSA A65; Brian Kuerschner- 1912 Triumph, 1953 AJS 18cs and AJS10r; Rob Mather-1932 Scott; Rob Smyth -1930 AJS series A car; Peter Wilksch's fabric saloon car; Colin Behn-1953 AJS; Pat Vartuli-1952 AJS; David Conway-1953 AJS; Paul Knapp-1951 AJS; Richard Rake -1964 AJS; Brian Gray and Alan Thyus with Matchless and Brian Forth-1957 Triumph.

The VVMCCSA display was divided into 3 sections of 10 VVMCCSA motorcycles on one side, then two 1930s AJS cars from Rob Smyth and Peter Wilksch in the middle, then 9 motorcycles of the **AJS and Matchless motorcycle owners group** organised by Brian Kuerschner.

When you walked around in the middle of the oval, you could see a sea of gleaming motorcycles from the BSA owners with 27 motorcycles which included the **BSA A65** the marque make for the event, the Norton owners with 10 motorcycles; Levis had 6 motorcycles listed; and Triumph Riders club SA with 14 motorcycles. Every club looked and present themselves as winners on the

day. The idea of all motorcycle in one location was well received by the large crown that attended with many staying in the area admiring the motorcycle display for a lengthy time.

Just before 1pm I was informed that the VVMCCSA had 'won' the best motor cycle display and would I select 4 to be displayed at the presentation area. The next surprise was that Steve Cramp's 1973 Triumph Hurricane was selected as the best motorcycle of the day. I had placed the Triumph Hurricane and the 1912 Triumph TT replica nose to nose in the middle of our display as the 'premier' motorcycles of our display. I watched as many people stop in their tracks when they came across these two machines. What a contrast of the old and the new gleaming in the sun. people hovered around, took many photos then made a closer inspected them.

We all then gathered at the presentation and received the accolades of the day.

Thanks to those members who attended with their motorcycles, assisted in setting up our display and liaised with the public discussing what we had on display. **Brian Forth.**



This episode is a day in the life of a young biker "Pablo" and his gold and black 1957 Triumph Thunderbird 650 which happened over fifty years ago. In those days the Emerson train crossing at the intersection of South and Cross Roads had no flyover bridge for South Road traffic. Trains crossing there often caused lengthy delays to traffic so the inventive minds of a group of young bikers found a way to speed up their situation. Young Pablo Pank was the last rider in this bunch one particular Friday night.

As five of them sped southwards along South Road that night, the traffic lights turned red against them at the last moment. With the road clear, they ducked the traffic lights by impulsively shooting across the double line, then cutting through the service station on the northwest corner of the intersection, before filtering through traffic across Cross Road to head down Railway Terrace.

Patrolling police in an HD Holden had seen these infringements and rushed through the side streets and intercepted the surprised lads, stopping them all. Pablo at the back, was hoping the leader would wear the inevitable booking and he'd be able to ride on, but he was out of luck. The dutiful officers booked them each in turn, repeating the same safety lecture before they were allowed to ride on.

Several weeks went by before the dreaded summons to appear in court arrived by personal delivery by the local copper. There were no slaps on the wrist, good behaviour bonds or other forms of soft-soaping by judges or magistrates in those days so Pablo was in a state of nervous anticipation. The hearing required him to appear during work time so he reluctantly approached his boss and explained the situation. Like most bosses, he only allowed Pablo to leave his workplace a short time before the hearing.

Pablo rode his Triumph briskly to the Colonel Light Gardens Police Station expecting the hearing to be there, but the sergeant at the desk told him he was in the wrong place, the court was in fact two miles further north on Goodwood Road beyond the subway under the railway line. With barely five minutes until he was due to appear, Pablo was in a state of panic. He kick-started his Thunderbird into life and tore north along Goodwood Road. As he entered the subway, he was frustrated by a big, old, white Jaguar ambling slowly along, blocking his passage in the middle of the road. In an adrenalin rush, he grabbed a fistful of throttle, cut across the double line and tore past the old Jag.

Less than a minute later Pablo rode into the court car-park, relieved to have got there in the nick of time. Standing there were all his mates ready to hear their fate. There was no vacancy for Pablo to park his bike except one place that had a sign, Police Business Only. Pablo squeezed his bike alongside another vehicle right on the edge of this space and was just about to dismount when a large, old, white Jaguar edged slowly into the same spot very close to his bike. With a feeling of impending doom, he recognised the same old Jaguar he had just roared past

An elderly, bespectacled, white-haired gentleman in a dark suit emerged from the car with a black brief-case and stared sternly at Pablo for a moment, then without a word headed into the court building. Pablo and his mates then moved inside to the waiting area. After a few minutes, the police prosecutor came out and asked who owned the orange Triumph, when told Pank was the owner, the officer muttered something about 'having done your dash now' and went back into the court room. All felt nervous but none of them had nearly as much dread as Pablo who was by now frightened he'd wet himself.

The mates soon fell silent. After a short and tense wait, a court official entered the waiting room and called out the names of all the young offenders except Pablo, to appear before His Honour. With a racing pulse, Pablo was left waiting, sweating and swallowing nervously. Each of the culprits was duly fined three pounds with one pounds court costs by the judge, not an insignificant sum in those days, and they were given a stern lecture about safety and the serious consequences of a repeat of their offence and were dismissed. Next, after what seemed a long time, Pablo, by then a nervous wreck, was called in. Peering over his glasses, His Honour spoke sharply,

"You must be Pank! Do remember passing a white Jaguar in the subway? Pank mumbled, 'no sir". Well you did, it was me Pank and not only have you dangerously crossed the barrier double lines on South Road recently as charged, you also crossed them when you rushed recklessly past me on your motorbike on the way here just a few minutes ago! Do you have anything to say for yourself?"

Pablo trembling, his mind confused and his mouth dry was lost for words. Terrified anything he might say would only make matters worse he could only hoarsely stammer,

"N-n-nothing Your Honour." The old judge then proceeded to lecture Pablo at length about safety and responsibility and as a multiple offender, the severe consequences of a repetition of this offence. For good measure the judge fined Pablo four pounds with one pounds court costs and dismissed him. Almost in a state of collapse, Pablo emerged to tell his mates the full story of his not-so-lucky encounter with the dawdling white Jaguar driven by the same judge along Goodwood Road just before the appearance.

For decades now, there has been a concrete barrier in the centre of busy Goodwood Road through the subway, so it is impossible for Pablo or anyone else to cross what were double lines there. In its drive to benefit the community by curbing crime, the state government has sold off both Colonel Light Gardens Police Station and the Goodwood Court-house. The old judge would have passed on long ago, and probably his Jaguar too. The world has moved on, but Pablo's memory of his offending and particularly the day of his hearing has most assuredly not! Pablo says he doesn't remember the rest of that day, but the memory of his desperate last minute dash to court and his encounters with the judge stay with him as if they happened just yesterday, and no he did not wet his pants? So the old judge did make quite a lasting impression

The ride had two short stops, one at Williamstown Hotel and the other at Lyndoch, a great opportunity to


