

Report from the recent Birdwod Farm Day 21st May 2017.

Having most recently completed the Membership application form to join the Adelaide Hills Motor Restorers Club at Mount Barker I was invited by several Club Members to join the group on Sunday May 21st to attend the Annual Birdwood Farm Day to aid the coffers of the local Birdwood Primary School. The weather conditions were absolutely perfect for the day in bright sunshine

considering the surrounding days leading up to and since the occasion. Certainly the most paraphernalia, memorabilia and machines I've ever displayed at an event the likes of this.

Taking most of the previous day to load the bikes in the conveniently accessible lift top covered in trailer and necessary equipment in the Adventra wagon

with an array of relevant significant display material I set off from Summertown at 07.15 to arrive in the tall timbered area of Mount Crawford State Forest at 08.15 within the grounds of Chalks Campground off Warren Road. Besides our AHMRC display of mostly choofing vintage stationary engines and classic cars, demonstrations of whip cracking, log chopping, blacksmithing, sheep shearing, animal nursery, pony and camel rides, school band and choir, live music and a first-class variety of other interesting attractions for the entire family say a full day of total fascinating entertainment.

Noticeable was the many youngish parents with clinging youngsters perched on the hip or being conveyed in small upmarket pushers. The clubs allocated most convenient prime corner location behind the restricted rollup fencing made for ample presentation of the many stationary engines along with generous sufficient area for our large 3mt x 6mt first ever at this event motorcycle display.

Much appreciated was the grateful assistance offered by Club Members to erect the sizeable gazebo, basic setup of our site along with the folding table open presentation and accompanying obligatory foldaway camping chairs. Having carefully arranged everything and in order with electric extension cables and power boards to power the few exhibits the time came to crank up the 240 volt Genset powering up the AJS cutaway engine, motorcycle engine roller starter, AJS table lamp and power point

presentation on the laptop .

Additional to our display was our own 1954 AJS 500cc Model 18CS Competition machine, 1954 Replica 10R AJS 500cc racer and the borrowed 1912 500cc TT Triumph. To my astonished surprize the key start battery on the Genset was found to be quite dead resisting any positive ignition. In search of a suitable battery and jumper leads Greg Strike and Mark Pavey came to my rescue. Before any coupling of jumper cable action was taken here Mark commented as to where the recoil pull starter might if any be situated. 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Conditional Historic Registration information

<u>The Federation of Historic Motoring Clubs of South Australia Inc</u> acknowledges and supports the approval by the South Australian Government in amending Regulation 15 of the Motor Vehicles Regulations 2010 to re-instate the rolling 30 year rule for Historic Vehicles, and the amendment of Regulation 16 to allow vehicles with approved modifications to be included in the Conditional Historic Vehicle Registration Scheme (CHVRS).

The CHVRS has been part of the Historic vehicle movement in South Australia since 1992 when the Federation of Historic Motoring Clubs in South Australia made representations to the Minister of the day on behalf of its member clubs. The Federation was successful in these representations to the Minister which resulted in the appropriate level of fees and charges made which reflected the reduced level of vehicle movements on our roads by Historic vehicles. At this time the Government and the Federation agreed that the Federation would partially administer the Scheme through the issue of Log Books.

In the meantime, a number of clubs with a proportion of membership, which had modified vehicles, began representations to the Government for their vehicles to be included under the same CHVRS. This process was denied, however the Street Rod Federation was successful admitted to the scheme and their affiliated clubs recognised by Gazette notices from November 2012. The Modified vehicle fraternity through the Street Machine Association continued their cause. The Federation of Historic Motoring Clubs did not actively support them but did not discourage them either. Representations to the Government by the Federation of Historic Motoring Clubs insisted that any representations by the Street Machine Association in furthering their cause was not to prejudice the existing CHVRS.

Since then the CHVRS has been enhanced with a level of responsibilities placed on the Federation, Vehicle Clubs and owners by means of a Code of Practice. A renewed Code of Practice to replace the one dated 2012, will be drafted by the Registrar of Motor Vehicles and in co-operation with the Federation of Historic Motoring Clubs SA Inc and its new format will operate from 1 July 2017.

As from 1 July 2017, a rolling 30 year rule applies whereby vehicles manufactured up to 31 December 1986 will become eligible for the CHVRS in South Australia. On 1 January 2018 this date will change to vehicles manufactured up to 31 December 1987.

Member Clubs are free to make their own decision as to whether or not to accept Historic vehicles which are modified into their Club. This is may be through a Constitutional or Club By-law decision. There is no compulsion to the revised scheme and your Club may choose to continue under the present arrangement.

The Federation commends the new rules to your Club and shares the commitment to continually promoting and preserving the historic fleet in South Australia.



I See the Light!

Some 65 years ago Associate Motor Cycles produced my 1950 AJS motorcycle complete with Lucas electrics. One of the more important components of Mr Joseph Lucas's supplied kit was his headlamp. It is approx. 7" in diameter and is equipped with a 6 volt 24 / 24 watt globe. In comparison to contemporary headlamps it is lacking. My father often recounts stories of riding his 1949 and later 1951 model AJS from Broken Hill to

Adelaide at night on dirt roads in the early 1950's. Impressed by his adventures I thought, I wonder what the then road test had to say about the performance of a Lucas headlamp? I quick search found a road test of a 1950 Matchless (same as an AJS) where the test report stated:

"Riding at night, the beam from the Lucas headlamp was more than adequate". The tester goes on to say, "It lit up the oncoming road with a brilliance that made fast motoring the rule rather than the exception". (Source Motorcycling in Australia 1950).

Whilst I've never ridden my bike at night and doubt that I ever will, I suspect the headlamp would not be up to the task. As I make a point of riding with my headlight on during the day I went looking to see what my options were to get more light output? I could get a 30watt headlight globe but that was approaching the limit of Mr Lucas's other component, the generator (maximum output 36 watt). My choice was to look to the future whilst riding a relic from the past. I decided to investigate LED on the back of a fellow club member's suggestion.

I purchased an LED headlamp unit for around \$27 which would require some adaption that was capable of running on 6 volt – 36 volt with high beam (3 LED's) / low beam (2 LED's). The three LED's are set up in a triangular fashion. Connected it to 6 volt and nothing? The same club member confirmed it would not emit



light under 9 volts!

The solution was to buy a small electronic circuit board that would increase 6 volt to something more. Jumped on eBay and found a couple of units that offered a solution. For a modest outlay I received two circuit boards. The budget model (\$6.90) was purchased but noted it may not be able to handle the current draw whilst the "premium" model (\$8.50) complete with big heat sink was capable of handling 100 watts.

I opted to use the premium circuit board that could handle the larger current. The board is easy to wire, power in & power out and includes a digital display that allows you to see the in/out voltage as you make your final adjustments.

With 6 volts in I set it up to provide around 11.5 volts out whilst keeping an eye on the current draw from my 6 volt test battery. So how does it rate?

I used a lux meter set up on my bench to measure the light quantity over a set distance for the old and the new. Albeit a rudimentary test rig, I recorded an increase in light of around 490%. A backyard test at night produced an amazing increase in light over the old.

Now the quality question? With the LED unit there is a distinct difference in light colour with a more white light along with a broader light pattern. The high/low beam function does not appear to alter the beam length as much as you might ordinarily see from the original pre focus globe.

Conclusion, yes the alterations and fiddling has been worth it to achieve a much more visible light for daytime riding. Like most things the test will be the ongoing use over a period of time. However, I have no intention of riding from Broken Hill to Adelaide at night! I continue to be surprised at what can be bought for so little that has the potential to be adapted to our older vehicles to make them safer, functional or just keep them going for longer. I hope this is of interest. **Stephen Hooper**


