

#### OXENBERRY WINERY TIDDLER RUN REPORT 26th August 2018

The Oxenberry Winery Tiddler Run was held on Sunday 26th August and followed a scenic route through some of the best motorcycling roads in the McLaren Vale winery region and the Southern Mount Lofty Rang-


Despite a forecast maximum of only 17 degrees the day was sunny and warm although jackets and gloves were appreciated when we were riding on the range escarpment as the temperature there dropped considerably.

The rally began at Oxenberry Winery in McLaren Vale and by 10.00am we had over 50 motorcycles with more still being unloaded from trailers. While the terrain of the south isn't optimal for veteran bikes we still has a good spread of vintage, classic and modern classic bikes. As usual, the southern rallies attract members from all over SA and over sixty motorcycles left Oxenberry at the rally start.

Our rally route took us towards Willunga, up Old Willunga Hill, and along the top of the range, via Brookman Road, through the back blocks to Yundi. This is scenic dairy country of winding, narrow roads with overhanging gum trees - just sensational for Sunday morning rides. Or any morning for that matter! Onwards to Nangkita (past the wonderful Blueberry Farm) we travelled to Bull Creek Road then to Ashbourne. At Ashbourne we stopped at The Greenman Inn which has been newly renovated and served us an absolutely delicious coffee and cake selection.

Leaving Ashbourne we travelled through Meadows, along Brookman Road in the Kuitpo Forest and down Peters Creek Road to join up with the main road back to McLaren Vale. Once back at Oxenberry we enjoyed a great sausage sizzle expertly cooked by Fil Scarpantoni, Daryl Rosser and other helpers.

As it is a tiddler rally I think tiddlers should rate the mentions in the rally report. Bikes that caught my eye were the lovely Triumph Cub (which sounded so fantastic in the forest), Pat Vartuli's Bantam Major which keeps up with bikes five times its size and a gorgeous little James whose owner I unfortunately missed speaking with (Ed- Peter Arriola's bike). Mick Clarke's Suzuki GT185 led the rally (thanks Mick) and Jane's Honda CB400F ran very sweetly. Great to see the number and variety of tiddlers increasing every year. If I missed any other tiddlers my apologies.



#### THE LIFE OF TYRES

Tyres should not need replacing on a machine during its first year, but in most cases they may be reckoned to be nearing their allotted span when the second twelve months of ownership has begun. A good  $24 \times 2\frac{1}{4}$  in. tyre for a miniature costs about 18s., and should run 8,000 miles on the rear wheel; owing to its smaller circumference it wears more quickly than a 26in. tyre of, say,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  in. section, which costs 33s. approximately, and will last out 9,000-10,000 miles on the back wheel of a 350 c.c. machine. A 700  $\times$  80mm. (26  $\times$  3in.) tyre on a 500 c.c. machine's driving wheel is worth well the 7s. or so more than the  $2\frac{1}{2}$  in. section cover; it has probably the longest life of any on a machine of this size—often 10,000 miles. A solo big twin similarly shod ought to cover 7,000 miles without serious tyre trouble.

Sidecars pull down the mileage figures for driving-wheel tyres very considerably. Even a 350 c.c. outfit throws enormous strains on the back tyre, which may need changing after 6,000 miles. The front tyre of a sidecar outfit wears more rapidly than that of a solo machine owing to steering strains and drag of the sidecar. The 500 c.c. outfit with  $26 \times 3$  in. covers scores by being adequately shod, and the tyre on the driving wheel should be serviceable after 7,000 miles. Smaller

tyres are inadequate even for medium-powered sidecars.

Depreciation must be counted as a very real expense in motor cycling, though it is an item frequently ignored. It is unpleasant to think upon, but nevertheless true, that a motor cycle or sidecar outfit is generally worth 20 per cent. less after a year's running, than was paid for it new. Thus, a £25 miniature would not fetch more than £20 after twelve months' use. A 250 c.c. lightweight bought for £34 new might sell for £27 after a year; a 1924 350 c.c. machine

costing £50 would be worth only £40 a year hence, and so on.

Although membership of one of the organizations which cater for the motor cyclist cannot be called an essential item in the cost of running a motor cycle, there is no gainsaying the fact that a rider gets excellent value for his subscription if he joins the Royal Automobile Club or the Automobile Association. Free legal defence, assistance on British and foreign tours, road patrols' aid in the case of a breakdown, and many other special facilities are some of the advantages which accrue to a member of either body. The R.A.C. also runs a free "get you home" scheme for its members who may be stranded on the road, and the A.A. has an efficient roadside telephone system. The annual subscription to the R.A.C. is £1, which is inclusive of an entry fee and badge fee. For membership of the A.A. the entry fee is 10s. 6d., annual subscription £1 1s., and 4s. 6d. is charged for the use of the badge.
