

Vale—Paul Knapp - Life member.

Paul Knapp (aka Pablo) is believed to have joined the VVMVVSA in 1987 as a young, energetic and enthusiastic owner of vintage and classic motorcycles. Paul started early, fiddling with old motorcycle's in his fathers garage, working on a red scooter before venturing onto bigger and faster motorcycles.

His oldest bike in a 1923 Humber that was used regularly, and it might have venture out of the shed if you twisted his arm hard enough.

Paul's first run was Birdwood Figure 8 on the Humber, then the early birds run to Parra Wirra where he rode his 1928 Levis, both motorcycles are still somewhere in the shed.

By 1988, Paul had restored a basket case 1957 Triumph Thunderbird 6t commonly known as 'Trumpet". When I returned to Adelaide in late 1988, I wanted to restore my 1957 Triumph Thunderbird and desperately need assistance. One of my contacts was Paul, this was my first meeting with Paul and was amazed at the restoration he had done. Paul made me welcome and gave me some good advice for my restoration and did to this present day.

Paul suggested I join the VVMCCSA where there were others with similar bikes so I did in 1992.

By July 1995, some 7 years after joining, Paul became a committee member for the first time and was a very active Committee member. At the AGM in July 2005, Paul took over the duties of records officer, the person who gathers, collate and maintains the meticulous records which allow us to be awarded the trophy's each June trophy night.

Paul has been a regular committee member since 1995, always willing to assist, organise and participate in club runs and events and doing his 'records officer duties', being corner Marshal and other club event that needed a volunteer. Every log book renewal day you would see Paul scribing for Bob Gill by keeping records for that scheme.

In 2014, Paul was appointed the 3rd Approved Person, a club appointed persons for historic registration scheme.

I presented life membership to Paul Knapp at July 2014 AGM.

3rd Strathalbyn ride-Sunday 16th September 2018

This ride was called a 'flat tanker society ride' as I was hoping for a large contingent of flat tank bikes attending. The number of motorcycles present were 25 with 5 Veterans, 4 outfits of Peter Scott—Scott, Dean and Audrey Govan—Triumph, Richard and Bob Kretschmer—Norton and Alf Lear—Ariel along with a gaggle of classic bikes.

I was in Victor Harbor on the Saturday where the weather was most unpleasant with a strong southerly wind coming off the southern ocean accompanied by rain and hail. I thought Sunday might suffer the same but no the sun came out, wind died down making it a very pleasant day.

Members gathered at the Goodyear business, parked their trailers and removed the motorcycles. Then around the carpark was the usual ritual of filling up petrol tanks, checking out their bikes and just socializing.

As there were no volunteers for back-up trailer from members, I completed that duty and Wayne Lawson volunteered to be the ride leader. By 10am Wayne and the marshal's headed off soon followed by the others. Terry's Raleigh refused to fire due to carby flooding but the bike was finally started and off we went.

The ride to Wellington was pleasant for me in the comfort of my car until I can across Richer and Bob Kretschmer stationary on the side, back of the sidecar open and sipping tea. They had stopped about 10k's from Wellington because of a blown head gasket. The Norton outfit was too big for my trailer and luckily a passing motorist gave Richard a ride back to Strathalbyn to get his car and trailer and finally joining us later on at Wellington.

We arrived at the Courthouse and Police museum, met by Heather the lease of the premises to a warm log fire and plenty of coffee, drinks and glorious homemade pies and pasties or chips and sauce. The premises are well maintained and have a cosily atmosphere with a lovely view of the River Murray. By 1pm we left and rode back to Strathalbyn, loaded out bikes on the trailer and headed for home.



Dear Sir,

Further to my letter llth June, the proposed display and Gymkana it is hoped to hold at Ridge Park, would be conducted approximately four times a year on Saturdays. Our Club which has recently been formed possesses some 30 motor cycles from 1901 to 1931 vintage, most of these machines have been restored to new condition, and we feel that they would create great interest if they were displayed as functioning motor cycles to the General Public. However, this alternate of useing Ridge Park would help us immensely.

Material for Felt Washers.

OLD felt hats should not be thrown away, but kept handy in the garage where they will form material from which oil-retaining washers of almost any size and shape can be cut. The fashioning of the washers will be quite easy if a razor blade is used to cut the felt. H.S.P.

ORDINARY household black lead, costing about 1d. a block, brushed sparingly on to threads which are prone to seize, such as those of a sparking plug, valve cap, etc., will enable the parts to be unscrewed easily when removal next becomes necessary.


This inexpensive material can also be used for polishing cylinders and, if mixed with oil, for lubricating driving chains.

Detachable Sidecar lamp Plug.

AN old Woods cycle valve and a block of ebonite formed the components of the electric plug shown in the sketch.

The block was drilled and the body of the valve pushed in and retained with its nut. A wireless split plug, to which was attached the

Hand-operated Dampers.


ON my machine the adjustment of the fork dampers had to be carried out by means of a spanner, but I fitted hand adjusters by making the adaptors illustrated in the accompanying sketch.

The spindle locking nut on the off side of the forks was forced into a piece of hexagonal tubing cut as shown. The tubing was heated to allow it to expand slightly before the nut was driven in. When cold, of course, both nut and tube were firmly fixed together. The arms, which were left on the tubing after cutting, were bent outward at right-angles and drilled. A furniture castor-cup, made of bakelite, was drilled in the centre with a hole big enough to admit the end of the spindle and was bolted to the arms on the piece of tubing. A similar adaptor was made and fitted to the hexagon at the head of the fork

Lubricating Side Valves.

IN the accompanying sketch is shown a simple but effective means of lubricating the stems of exposed side valves. A thick felt washer, soaked in oil, is pushed over the valve stem before the spring cup is fitted. It is kept pressed against

the lower end of the valve guide by means of a light compression spring which is retained by the cup and cotter. Oil should be squirted on to the washer at frequent intervals.

Touching Up Gold Lines.

WHEN the gold lines and lettering on the petrol tank get shabby they can be touched up, here and there, by dissolving a little gold sealing-wax in methylated spirits, and applying with a brush. It makes quite a satisfactory paint, which has more body than ordinary gold paint, and is less susceptible to the action of petrol. The idea can be used for other colours as well, and if necessary a coat of varnish can be applied afterwards. S.V.


To Solve a Problem.

THE following tip will solve the problem of holding overhead valves firmly whilst the springs are removed.

When the cylinder head is removed, leave the valves in position, plug up the sparking plug hole, and grease the interior of the head. Pour in some molten lead until the head is filled, then leave to cool off.

The casting thus made should be drilled for a piece of string or a piece of wire so that it may be hung up in the garage for future

This process will not damage the head in any way. L. Bennett.


