

PARAMOUNT among the models on the Ariel stand was the redesigned Square Four. Crowds packed round a beautiful sectional model of this new engine, which, with its light-alloy cylinder block and cylinder head, is nearly i-cwt lighter than its predecessor. Iron-alloy cylinder liners are used; and there are nickel-chrome steel valve inserts in the cylinder head.

Cylinder block, pistons and liners all have the same rate of expansion under heat, so that very small piston clearances can be used, which should obviate piston

can be used, which should obviate piston slap.

Of 997 c.c., the engine has a single camshaft which operates push-rods for the overhead rockers. The twin crankshafts are coupled by gears. For the front crankshaft a roller bearing is used on the drive-side, and a white-metal-lined bronze bush on the timing side. Drive-side of the rear crankshaft has two roller bearings, one of which is an outrigger, and the timing side has a white-metal-lined bush. Replaceable, white-metal-lined steel shells are fitted to the big-ends of the con-rods.

Coil ignition is employed, with a cartype distributor and automatic advance-and-retard mechanism.

Second, probably, in crowd-drawing was the 498 c.c., o.h.v. vertical-twin. Twin camshafts operate the push-rods in this engine, of which a cut-away model was on view. A one-piece forged crankshaft is used. Both de Luxe and Red Hunter versions of the Twin are available

The Ariel spring-frame was shown, complete with a sectioned gear box; and there was a sectioned Ariel telescopic hydraulically damped front fork.







PROTECTION OF THE EYES.

S EVERAL doctors have said lately that many minor ophthalmic complaints are due to motoring. Though usually not very serious, these complaints are annoying, and, if possible, should be avoided.

The most usual ones are inflammation, and, more serious, a strain on the muscles of the eyes, which brings on headache, though this is also caused by other things.

Inflammation, shown by the eyes feeling hot, watering, or being bloodshot, is caused by either road dust or wind. It can best be prevented by keeping the goggles always over the eyes.


The second complaint is a variety of ordinary eye strain, as it is caused by the continual alteration of focus necessary for safe motoring. Another cause of headache is the reflection of the sun's rays on tarred roads. If possible, avoid travelling westwards late in the afternoon.

There are two possible means of preventing this last complaint. One is available only to those machines equipped with handle-bar screens, on which a miniature "vizor" could be fastened. The other is to have a student's eye-shade attached to the peak of the helmet.

SCARPANTONI ESTATE WINES RALLY - SUNDAY 25th NOVEMBER 10.00am

The Scarpantoni Estate Wines Rally for 2018 will be held on Sunday 25th November commencing at 10.00am.

Scarpantoni Winery is located in Scarpantoni Drive, McLaren Flat.

On arrival, motorcycles should be lined up on the concrete apron next to the winery. Cars and trailers should be parked on the lower carpark to the west of the winery.

After the usual pre-rally briefing and photographs we will depart the winery and head west on the main road then after a short distance turn right into Blewitt Springs Road. Riding through the less-travelled back roads of McLaren Flat and Blewitt Springs we will be treated to panoramic views of the Willunga Basin. Reaching Kangarilla Road we turn right and head to Wickham Hill Road - a steep, twisty climb to the top of the range. This road is certainly easier going uphill than down but care should be taken on the tight, sometimes switchback, corners. At top of the hill we join Range Road for ten kilometres of fantastic riding - sweeping corners on excellent surfaces. Eventually we turn down Pottery Road to meet Brookman Road and quite a long straight run through Kuitpo Forest. At Meadows there are at least two coffee shops and a bakery so we plan to stop for about thirty minutes for refreshments.

Leaving Meadows we head to Kangarilla via Dashwood Gully Road and then towards Clarendon. Before we reach Clarendon however, we turn onto Bakers Gully Road and follow the Onkaparinga Gorge all the way to the outskirts of McLaren Vale. From the rolling winery country near Chapel Hill we head back to Scarpantoni's by Kays Road and Whitings Road. Back at the winery the team will have the usual barbeque waiting.

The route this year has been chosen to select some of the best riding roads close to McLaren Vale whilst taking riders through some of the most scenic areas on offer. With the vineyards in full leaf the area should look stunning.

As usual we need Marshalls. This rally requires a minimum of ten Marshalls and we would very much appreciate assistance. If you haven't marshalled before please come and see me - it's not difficult and doing one or two rallies a year shares the load.

Please complete your rally entry forms - no matter what machine you are riding - and give them to the Club Captain before or on the rally day.
