



Birdwood Figure 8-Sunday 17th March 2019.

It's 9am and the rear gates of the National Motor museum opened and slowly in small groups members arrived. The temperature was in the low 30's which probably prevented some members from attending, but there are numerous other events on which would attract members away from the Club outing.

The scary moment came when Ian and Bob filled their petrol tanks and simultaneously both were able to overflow the tanks having petrol overflowing over the bikes. The bikes were quickly cleaned and dried off before they could be started. We stood by with fire extinguishers as a matter of safety. Both bikes fired up on first attempts with no problems.

Veteran riders were Ian Hese on his 1914 Douglas, Bob Gill on his 1913 BSA and Terry Rowe on his 1914 Bullock were the only veterans to venture out.

35 members and friends were briefed on the days rides then we began the mornings epic and torturous first ride thru the hills. The ride was about 60kms long, we had to negotiate road works and loose gravel in the middle of the roads

especially on corners and some very rough road surface along with a steady stream of other motorcyclists and cars. We stopped at Mt Pleasant for refreshments before heading back to Birdwood for lunch.

While waiting at a corner with you motorcycle standing silently next to you all you have is the quietness of the surrounding area. This is quickly broken by the sounds of the approaching veteran motorcycle, no not your modern road going Jap or European bikes but the gentle rumbling sound of a veteran bike with its steady popping sound of a 1913 BSA or a 1914 Douglas or 1914 Bullock (bike that is) quickly followed by the loud screaming noise of a Bantam in top gear I suspect, to the roar of a Norton 850 Commando to steady thumping noise from the many single pot BSAs, Triumphs, Matchless and AJS. Somewhere in the middle were the two outfits with passengers quietly meandering along. Then when you see Bill with the backup trailer approaching, you know your time there has finished, so you start your bike and join the ride.

Back at Birdwood we found it easy to collapse on the lawn for lunch and just as we were settled in the ride master *Wayne* demanded we rise for the afternoon ride. Slowly, I mean really slowly we got up.

About 1.30pm we left on the second 'shortish' ride of about 20km via Mt Torrens, Lobethal and Forreston and back to Birdwood. The only incident was Bob Gill running out of petrol about 10ks from Birdwood and he was

conveyed back to Birdwood.

Numbers were down but we had 35 members and friends that started the ride which is about the same as last year, but gone are the days of 80 plus bikes graced the lawn area and the family picnic atmosphere in the grounds has disappeared into memories, is it time for a change?

It turned out to be a beautiful day for riding in the Adelaide Hills, temperature in the low 30c made riding a tad warm but we enjoyed the day.

Most desirable bike went to Bob Gill. Regards—Maximus BS.






On Sunday the 24th of March, 23 members displayed their Motorcycles and a bicycle on the upper forecourt at Moseley Square Glenelg.




I remember Dad saying the light, a carbide lamp, cost the seventeen shillings extra.

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South Australia's Affiliated Motor Cycle Clubs

ELLIOTT, CALTHORPE & PAN-THER .- The Elliott, Calthorpe and Panther Club is one of the oldest motor cycle clubs in the State, and has been continuously in existence. The club was formed in 1924 with Mr. C. J. Malone, first secretary. From the inception of the club Mr. L. A. Elliott has shown a very keen interest in its affairs, and club members are very appreciative of the good work he has He has been elected patron regularly every year. The first president, Mr. R. S. Blaiklock, has maintained an active interest in the club for a much longer period than any other member, with the possible exception of the present secretary, Mr. L. J. Rowley. Looking back through the minutes we find this entry:


"Moved that Mr. Blaiklock be elected as a life member . . . Mr. Blaiklock was one of the foundation members, in 1924, and since then he has been a staunch supporter. It is largely due to Mr. Blaiklock's energy that the club has been in constant activity during the

seven years of its existence . . . The motion was carried unanimously." Other stalwarts of the early days were: the late W. Macklin, Mr. R. Stevens, the late H. Franklin, Messrs. W. Field, L. J. Rowley, L. Whittingham, S. N. Rowe and F. Benish. For some years Mr. R. S. Blaiklock presented an annual cup for a fifty mile race at Sel-Later, as with other clubs, novelty events, treasure hunts, speedjudging tests, and the like, were introduced. In 1927 the first winter trial was held, and this has proved to be the most popular fixture. Prominent among present members are: Ray Trevena (captain), who has been most successful in open club trials, Ron Maher (vice-captain), Howard Kotz (minute secretary), Len Rowley (secretary), Harry Moule (chairman), and Geoff Lavender (marshal), committeemen are-Pip Herbert, A. Cottrell, Max Rodiguez and Glen Leverington.

ARIEL—The Ariel Club has been in operation since 1932, and at that time its membership contained many well-known speedmen. most popular event on the calendar of the club is the Ariel Six-hour Trial, and is perhaps one of the most important fixtures held during the winter Attracting many novice as well as seasoned riders, the event has become very popular. An average of about 30 members attend the fortnightly meetings which are held on a Tuesday night, at Scott Signs, Pirie Street, Adelaide. Although some of the pioneer members have dropped active membership, they still attend upon certain occasions and regale present members with tales of the past. Mr. R. Moody is the president of the club, and Mr. W. D. Bates, of 43 Arthur Street, Unley, is the secretary.

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NORTON—One of the youngest clubs affiliated with the Motor Cycle Clubs of South Australia is the Norton Club, which was formed in 1935. However, it has taken an active part in all open competitions organised in the State, and in connection with the Centenary celebrations, it successfully ran one of the most ambitious speed meetings attempted in South Australia. Hill climbs and scrambles are the most popular open events conducted by the club. Meetings are held every Monday night at the clubrooms, Tavistock Hotel, Rundle Street, and the average attendance is about 20 members. The office of president and chairman of the club is at present held by Mr. Verdi Barlow, and the secretary is Mr. Bill Oatway.

PORT PIRIE—The Port Pirie Club was formed in 1924, and since that time all types of competitions have been promoted by the club. The outstanding events of the year are the annual mystery ramble and the annual dinner. Dances and socials are conducted by the club to provide finance as well as enjoyment. Many veteran members are still actively interested in club affairs, the most active of these being Messrs. Ivan Mortess, Bill Cunningham, and Colin Bottrall. Meetings are held fortnightly, on a Tuesday, in Alexander Street, Port Pirie, the average attendance being 20. Mr. Ivan Mortess is president of the club and Mr. Melv. Scarman, of 27 Seventh Street, Port Pirie, is the secretary.

NEW ADELAIDE—Formed in 1936, the New Adelaide Club has as its nucleus several members of the old Unley City Club, and meets on the first and third Thursday in each month at the clubrooms, in Market Street, Adelaide, which have been generously provided by the president (Mr. Jack Chapman). Since the reorganisation of the club many successful fixtures have been conducted, notably the Sellick's Beach speed meeting and the combined clubs' week-end at Murray

Chapman Motors, Adelaide.

INDIAN AND B.S.A.—The Indian and B.S.A. Club was first formed in 1925 and was the first club to be affiliated with the parent body. The club meets on alternate Mondays at Taylor Buildings, Hindmarsh Square, and the average attendance is about 30 members. Mr. H. G. Tralaggan is the president of the club, and Mr. W. G. Lapthorne, of 62 Ayers Avenue, Mitcham Park, is the secretary.

ATUJARA—The Atujara Club was formed in 1930 and had a prosperous time until it went into recess in 1931. A reformation took place in 1935, but the club still felt the depression and it went out of existence four

months later. In November this year it was reformed with 24 members attending the first meeting, and it now has grown steadily to 60 members. Although the club has no annual fixture on its calendar it is aiming at a six-hour light novelty trial. Meetings are held at its own clubrooms, 85 Grote Street, Adelaide, and the average attendance is about 30 members. Many original members are still connected with the club, and Mr. Les. Bray still holds the position of president, and the secretary is Mr. Bert. Kemp, of 55 Richmond Avenue, Colonel Light Gardens.

DOUGLAS—The Douglas Club was formed in 1930 and its members have actively interested themselves in all forms of registered fixtures in South Australia. The club's annual event is the novelty trial which, although

RAA magazine 'SaMotor'—Lane Filtering.

It's peak hour and traffic has backed up along South Australia's arterial roads. While you're stuck in traffic, a motorcycle rides past between vehicles and stops at the front of the queue to cross an intersection.

Surely that's not legal', you think. But you might be surprised to find out, it is.

<u>Lane filtering</u> – where a motorcycle rider travels at low speed in between 2 lanes of slow moving or stationary vehicles – was made legal in South Australia in 2017.

While the practice can help with congestion and be safer for motorcyclists, there are precautions both riders and drivers need to take to ensure the practice remains safe.

For motorcyclists—Keep it legal. Motorcyclists need to follow a number of rules when lane filtering.

They should only filter when it's safe and practical, travel no faster than 30km/h, and make every attempt to avoid collisions.

Only motorcyclists on R and R-date, P2 licences can lane filter.

People with a P1 provisional or learner's permit are not allowed to. Motorcyclists are prohibited from lane filtering in bike lanes and through roundabouts, school zones and crossings.

The penalty for unlawful lane filtering is a \$379 fine plus a \$60 Victim of Crimes Levy, and attracts 3 demerit points.

Check the gap

Before you weave your way through banked up traffic, make sure there's enough room. If you're unable to safely navigate the lane and merge back into vehicle flow, hang back and wait until it's safe.

Motor bike lane filtering will be legalised in South Australia from 15 April 2017. Lane filtering is when a motor bike rider travels at low speed in between two lines of stationary or slow moving traffic travelling in the same direction.

Strict conditions apply to lane filtering:

- only permitted at speeds of 30km/h or slower
- only permitted when safe to do so
- not permitted in a school zone or across pedestrian and children's crossings
- not permitted next to parked cars or between vehicles and the kerb, or on roundabouts
- not permitted in bicycle, bus or tram lanes
- only permitted by R and R-Date licensed motor bike riders.

Persons with a P1 Provisional or Learner's permit and moped riders with a car licence only must not lane filter

The penalty for unlawful lane filtering is a \$363 expiation fee and 3 demerit points.
