

Hi, I thought this might be of interest for the next smoke Signal. So I am not alone in having a Quadrant. Mine is a 1913 Model, no clutch or gearbox and I imported this from the UK because I really wanted an example of this make. I believe mine is a TT Model because the original cams are certainly not touring pattern and the bike certainly goes well. To establish if it really is a TT model I need to remove the barrel and check if it is a 500cc. The touring Quadrants all seem to be 450cc or 550 ccs but not 500cc. While the bike is running well I don't want to disturb it, that can come later. The Wikipedia article is not quite correct. Quadrant started in Coventry and only later moved to Birmingham. In the veteran period they were associated with the famous Tom Silver who set up some outstanding endurance records with a Quadrant. He was also very much involved on the design side at Quadrant and appears in many of their early adverts.





Sorry no I don't have those and I don't have anything else. I wish I did but I'm still searching for anything but I can't find out any information as my uncles have all passed away now.




