



CENTRAL HILLS RIDE 16 JUNE 2019.

It's risky business organising a ride only a few days short of the Winter solstice.

BULLOCK Motorcycles.

John Bullock established his cycle business at home in 1896, and moved to 150 Hansen Street, Adelaide, South Australia shortly afterwards. By 1901 he had moved to 101 Pirie Street. In 1902 where he built a water-cooled car and motor quadricycle.

Bullock motorcycles were advertised from 1902 but these were simply Werners with the Bullock name on them.

A second shop was added at 65 Rundle Street in 1904, as the Bullock Cycle & Motor Cycle Stores became one of the largest motor and cycle businesses in the state, with agencies for a wide variety of English and American makes.

Healing-made Precision motorcycles were sold with the Bullock name circa 1914, as were various models of Sun Precision and Sun VTS. A surviving Bullock Precision uses a 2³/. hp OHV engine in a lightweight Sun frame. Bullock JAP and Abingdon motorcycles were also sold.

POINTS FROM MOTOR VEHICLES ACT.

Glaring Headlights.

No person shall carry on his motor vehicle any lighted lamp from which emanates rays of light capable of dazzling or confusing any person. This regulation shall be deemed to be complied with if no portion of the main shaft of light emanating from the lamp is elevated more than four feet above the surface of a level roadway, at any point one hundred feet or more ahead of such lamp.

Lighting.

Motor cars being driven or left standing between half-anhour after sunset and half-an-hour before sunrise must have attached:—

- (a) Two lighted lamps, carried one on each side of the car, and so constructed as to show a bright white light in front of the car.
- (b) A lighted lamp on the off side of the rear of the car, and the lamp so constructed and carried as to illuminate and render easily distinguishable from a distance of at least forty feet each figure and letter on the rear number-plate, and also to show a red light, to be clearly visible to any person approaching from the rear.

If trailers are attached to the motor car, the rear light must

be on the rear of the last trailer.

Lighting Exemption.

In the case of motor cars left standing, it is only necessary for the off-side headlight or side light to be left burning, there being no need for either a near-side light or rear light. If the car is left standing under or near a lighted street lamp and is clearly visible, there is no necessity for any lights at all.

Spot Lights.

Spot lights can only be used:—

- (a) For the purpose of examining any part of the car, and for making adjustments and repairs. The light must not be projected more than twenty feet from the vehicle.
- (b) When not within the boundaries of any municipality or town or township, to read a finger-post or notice-board, and for no longer time than is necessary for such purpose.

Speed Limits.

No person shall drive a motor vehicle:-

(a) In any street or road in any municipality, or in any street or road in any town or township outside a municipality, at a greater speed than twenty miles an hour.

- (b) In any street or road (not being within a town or township) outside a municipality, at a greater speed than thirty miles an hour.
- (c) At a greater speed than six miles an hour when passing any tramcar (either in Adelaide or elsewhere) which is stopped for the purpose of permitting passengers to board the same or to alight therefrom.

(d) At a greater speed than fifteen miles per hour when passing any school, at any time when children are going

into or coming out of such school.

These speed limits apply to the whole of the State. District Councils or Corporations have no power to impose local speed Emits.

TAX ON MOTOR VEHICLES.

The tax on a motor vehicle must be paid by the person who was registered as the owner of the vehicle on the 1st January, Le the tax for the financial year-1st July, 1924, to 30th June, 1925—must be paid by the person registered as the owner on the 1st January, 1925. When a car is sold, application should mmediately be made to the Registrar to cancel the registration of the car.

The tax must be paid before the 31st March next, and the following is the scale of tax:-

Licences.

The fees payable for a license are five shillings in the case of a license to drive a motor car, and two shillings and sixpence for a motor cycle. Licenses issued between the 1st of January and 30th June are charged at half above rates.

All licenses expire on the 30th June next after the issue of

the license, and must be renewed on the 1st July.

Licenses are not issued to persons suffering from any serious physical incapacity, unless the Registrar is satisfied that the applicant is competent to drive a car with safety to the public.

The age limit for a person to obtain a license to drive a motor car is sixteen years, and fourteen years in the case of a driver of a motor cycle.

Mildura Meander.

The "Mildura Meander" is an annual two day rally hosted by the Sunraysia Historic Motorcycle Club. This year it was held over the weekend of 17-18th May and attracted around seventy motorcycles including fifteen from South Australia.

In amongst the South Aussies I spotted at least seven VVMCC members. Jim Motillo, my son Alex and I were doing a four day ride and we stopped in at Mildura to take part in the rally on the Saturday.

The rally is characterised by that great Riverland friendliness and a very wide range of machines from vintage motorcycles to moderns. I am a regular visitor to Mildura and considered that I knew the area very well having ridden there many times to visit family. It was a pleasant surprise to find the route taken by the rally introduced me to scenery I had no idea existed!

The ride on Saturday comprised a section known to locals as "The Spider's web". This road is popular with cyclists and motorcyclists and features 80km/hr twisty sections almost all the way to Red Cliffs.

If you, like me, thought Mildura equated to dead straight roads then you must ride this on your next visit to Mildura.

We stopped for morning tea at an antique machinery museum featuring all kinds of trucks, tractors and other machines. One tractor looks just like another to me but Jim was all over them reliving his youth!

Following another ride, this time though mostly mallee, we stopped for an excellent lunch at the Werrimull Hotel. In the afternoon the rally route took riders back to Mildura via Lake Cullulleraine.

We had a family engagement and followed Pat Vartuli (who was riding Daryl Rosser's Triumph for the weekend) back to Mildura by on a different road.

The rally dinner was held at a Chinese restaurant on Saturday night and after dinner, Pat who hails from Mildura took us on a walking tour of the night spots!

I'd recommend the rally to anyone looking for a weekend in the sun (it is ALWAYS sunny in Mildura according to the locals). At just on five hours ride from Adelaide it's an easy jaunt for moderns or classics too. Regards

As there are not many food outlets in the area we will be cooking a BBQ lunch.


It is a good outing for all the family. Bring your grandchildren or children, as many younger ones have not ridden in a tram.
