



Strathalbyn to Goolwa tiddlers ride

Sunday's ride around the lake to Goolwa was a very pleasant ride as the weather was in the low 20's with a cloud cover making riding pleasurable.

Around 9am, members started to gather at the Goodyear garage in Strathalbyn, many had trailered their bikes and unloaded them and performed the usual pre-event check before starting the bike to ensure they will be a part of the ride. While this was going on other members arrived by riding to Strathalbyn. A total of 27 motorcycles were ready for the ride.

Unfortunately Robb Elliott's 1924 Indian expired after a few kilometres and was carried on a trailer for the remainder of the day.

Briefing was conducted and by 10am we headed off to Milang then stopping at the Sails at Clayton Bay café for a re-group, coffee etc.

Here Pat Vartuli discovered the Bantam's patrol tank had split and leaking fuel, his ride was over for the day. Pat drained the 'hot Bantam fuel' into a red container then sold the fuel for many Euros or Russian <u>rubles</u> to Tony Morisset who's Jawa was by now running on fumes only. Members then manhandled the Bantam onto the trailer—well lifted onto the back up trailer and secured. Pat unfortunately enjoyed the remained of the ride in comfort?

Then there was Brett Mitchell's 1914 Douglas on its first run when he incurred the loss of the magneto advance and retard lever and the rear light becoming very loose and had to be wired back onto the bike, but in the end the Douglas was retired to being carried around the course in Brett's vehicle.

We then rode onto Goolwa and regrouped at the Caltex for fuel then in a group rode down to the Goolwa wharf and parked the bikes for a lunch break.

By 1.30pm we left, regrouped then rode back to Strathalbyn via back roads. We did encounter a flock of sheep but they were negotiated with ease. Alf Lear dramatically slowed down on the Ariel outfit so much that my 1924 HD was able to catch up to him only later to discover he had clutch problem and was nursing the bike home.

A wheeled cavalcade of motoring history

The towns roads were congested with more traffic than usual last week and motorists could be forgiven for grinding their teeth as they crawled along the highway behind old vehicles.

Port Augusta played host not only to 104 vintage motorbikes, but also to a hefty sprinkling of vintage cars that graced Highway One with the charm of yesteryear.

It was a rare opportunity for lovers of fine old machinery to see motorbikes dating back to 1912 in all their uncomfortable simplicity, chrome shining and paint gleaming.

The bikes from SA, WA, NSW, Victoria and Queensland are touring the State for the 30th anniversary of the Veteran and Vintage Motorcycle Club of SA Inc.

They set up a display at the Stirling North hall that attracted hun-

dreds of bike devotees and along with the club dinner raised \$1700 for the Royal Flying Doctor Service.

The oldest bike was a 1912 Kirmer 500cc from Victoria, and other names from the past included Sunbeam, Velocette, Panther, Norton Indian and Ariel. There were also a few of the industry's stayers on display: Harley Davidson, Triumph and BMW.

Accomanying them were 172 owners and their passengers ranging in age from early 20s to late 70s.

But what is the attraction of restoring and owning a vintage motorcycle?

According to the club captain, Gary Jolly: "They're uncomfortable, they vibrate, they're not real fast, but they're a lot of fun."

"There's no answer for it. We


just like bikes, that's it."

In a true show of devotion and with deference to the insurance company, Gary slept with the bikes on the floor of the Stirling North hall.


The Port Augusa Vehicle Restorers Club also played host to some veteran visitors.

Hill family all mounted up for **Bay-to-Birdwood**

For almost as long as he can remember Ross Hill has been drawn to motor cycles.

His enthusiasm began shortly before his 14th birthday when he began assembling bits and pieces to build his first motor bike.

Now his infectious attraction has been caught by others in his family.

And when this year's third Bay-to-Birdwood run for historic vehicles and motor cycles gets underway on September 30, at least nine members of the Hill family will set off on seven of the family's fleet of 16 bikes.

"Up until only a few years ago it was only my father, (Alby), brother (Bob) and myself who rode, but today everyone likes history and nostalgia, so we've encouraged others in the family to take up riding," Ross said.

"We've lent them bikes and now some have gone out and acquired their own. It's nice to see the family interest growing."

The Hill "motor cycle team" includes four generations of Hills and is made up of Ross' sister Mrs Joy Pauley, nieces and nephews.

And the collection of bikes worth more than \$100,000 from which they will choose their mounts, reads like a "Who's Who list of motorcycles.

A 1906 Swiss Motosocoches is the oldest in the collection which also includes a 1912 Singer, a 1914 Rex, almost enough Harley Davidsons for the entire family to ride one each, a 1923 U.S. Neracar, a rare 1923 Ace and sidecar, a 1926 Henderson and side car, a 1937 Rudge Ulster, a 1950 English built Turner Tri-car with 126 miles (about 203 km) on the speedometer and a 1950 BSA Bantam.

While the rest of the family might be scratching their heads as to what motor cycles to select, there are no doubts about which one Ross will be astride.

His choice for the run is a rare Swiss-built

1907 Moto Reve he's ridden in the previous two Bay-to-Birdwood runs.

"She's a grand old bike," Ross said, "although you've got to ride her with feeling, and she needs a little assistance from the pedals on some of the steep hills.

"You only have to decompress the engine, start peddling for a short distance, return the compression and she pops off and you're on

Ross's father initially came across the machine in 1934 when he acquired it in Adelaide for two friends for the equivalent of

The two new owners rode and tinkered with the bike before World War II broke out. One was killed in action and, after the war,

the other moved to Victoria, taking the Moto

By this time Ross' interest in motor cycles had mushroomed and he set about tracking down the machine. In 1950 he finally acquired it minus some vital engine compo-

"Dad's always been mechanically inclined and he likes looking after machinery. He eventually got it going after he had hand-built a new carburettor for her," Ross said.

"In the first Bay-to-Birdwood run I took the precaution of carrying a back-up motor in the ute following the run because I had some doubts about the magneto and sure enough I only made it to Tea Tree Plaza before she

"It was only a matter of undoing a few bolts and I had the motor out and replaced it with one we'd built up from bits and pieces we'd collected.

"Then the carby began playing up so I had to rebuild that on the side of the road, but she eventually got up to the Mill.

"In the last Bay-to-Birdwood she flew up the hill to the Mill, getting up to 25 miles an hour in some spots.'

Ross doesn't pamper his bikes. "They're meant to be ridden," he said, "and as long as you don't push them they'll usually get you where you want to go." Ross should know because he's ridden his 77-year-old machine to Murray Bridge and Clare.

"It's a fine machine, and I can remember when I was a boy, there were dozens of bikes like this lying around the Burnside rubbish tip," he said.

It was from that tip that Ross scrounged bits and pieces as a 14-year-old to build his own motor cycle.

He proudly shows a 40-year-old newspaper clipping describing his exploits in building a "bitzer bike" and his eventual arrest for riding without a licence, insurance

More than 200 bits and pieces from various motor cycles went into the sevenmonth-long project to build the bike.

"Even after all these years I'm still out there collecting bike parts and all my mates know to keep an eye out for anything that might be useful," he said.

"Old bikes turn up in the oddest places and you get hold of them through some pretty unusual dealings.

The 1923 American-built Ace and sidecar, thought to be the only one of its kind in South Australia, came into the family through a lengthy deal involving a funeral payment.

We knew that the Ace was around, but we'd lost track of it until a friend of a friend heard that it was stored in a repair shop." Ross said.

"After some negotiating I got it for 35 pounds (\$70). It seems the owner had loaned a woman the 35 pounds so she could pay her husband's burial costs and she had given him the Ace as collateral.

"The widow wasn't too well off and there was little chance that she would ever be able to repay the money so the chap was quite happy to let the Ace go for the amount of the





BAROSSA VALLEY RIDE OCTOBER 20th 2019 10.00am

This will be the second time that we have used this start point.

The main start point is the old mechanical business premises between the <u>CFS Station & the Uniting Church on Black Top Road</u>, (the main road), at <u>One Tree Hill</u>, northern side of Adelaide.

The trailers can be parked off the road in the front of the building. The Throttle Shed, a motorbike friendly café, is almost opposite, if you need that before or after ride coffee or snack.

We will ride through natural scrub, past the Para Wirra National Park to Williamstown and then onto Lyndoch for a regroup and loo stop.

For the riders who want a shorter ride or those on lower powered machines, you can meet us at Lyndoch. The meeting point is the <u>Lyndoch Village Green car park</u> opposite the Bakery on the main road as you come in from Gawler, this is the one that we use on the Kersbrook Tiddlers Run. There is ample room to park trailers in the street or even one or two in the parking bay. Suggest that you be there and ready to ride by 10.30am.

From here we will meander through Tanunda and onto the morning tea stop. This stop will be at a private museum owned by Eric and Pam Parker. The \$5 fee will gain entry to the museum to see a collection of predominately Ariel motorbikes (square 4s prevail), various cars and model train layouts, as well as being supplied with a cuppa and biscuits.
