

BEARDS AND OLD MOTOR BIKES

Spectators stood spellbound this afternoon as veteran motorcycles dating back to 1901, with bearded riders, rode in procession. It was the first all motorcycle veteran rally held in Adelaide. The rally was a lesson in evolution of the motorcycle over the past half century, for, in the rear, came streamlined smooth engined 1950 models.

OLD BIKE KONKS OUT

Feature of the rally was a 1901 Minerva. Three days ago 70% of its parts were missing. It had no ignition, no carburettor and no belt. The engine had seized and had to be rebuilt. Young Mr E.A. (Screw) Rooney, 22, a mechanic of Murray Street, North Adelaide, got to work on it. He worked night and day until he finished the job at 1.15 pm today. It konked out in King William Street and had to be wheeled back to the Torrens parade ground. But Rooney got his reward by being awarded the prize for having put most work into getting his veteran machine into working order.

The rally, which was organised by the Two-ee Motorcycle Club, was opened by the Lord Mayor (Mr Rymill). In dispatching the riders he said, 'I hope you all get to your destination'. Most of them did, including a 1901 Motosacoche, ridden by R E Hill of Magill Rd, Tranmere, who was awarded the prize for the most original veteran motorcycle to finish the course through the city. In the 1918-1929 Vintage class, Mr A B Schulze of Schulze Road, Paradise, was awarded 1st prize for having the best turned out motorcycle. One or two of the veterans had no tyres at all. They rode on the rims. Tilbrook Industries won the prize for the best turned out 1950 motorcycle display. This included the first South Australian public exhibition of the new Austrian Puch motorcycle. There is still one prize £2-2-0 to be collected, donated by J N Taylor Ltd. It will be awarded to the person who can prove he has the oldest motorcycle in South Australia is registered and still running.

Rob Smyth, who passed away on 2nd October, aged 81, was an enthusiastic member of both the Veteran and Vintage MCC and the Classic Owners Motorcycle Club.

Anybody who knew him would be aware of his incredible skill level and of his generosity and great personality. He attended virtually every meeting of the Classic Owners Club for over 20 years and was on most weekday rides and moped rides that the club held during that time. He knew more about cars and old motorcycles than most people and was extremely generous in sharing his time and skill. There would often be a queue of people wanting to ask him questions at club meetings. Rob joined the VVMCCSA in 1985 and was awarded Life Member in 2011. He was Club Captain of V&V 1998-2000 and again 2003-2006.

He loved engineering, mechanical and electrical. He fabricated almost every type of component in his back yard workshop for his restorations. If a club member had a problem, either a phone call or a visit to Rob's cramped, but well set up, back-yard workshop would always result in the problem being solved. Before retiring Rob was the workshop manager at the University of SA's Mawson Lakes Campus.

His interest spanned motorcycles, cars, and scale model ride-on steam trains (which he fabricated from scratch). He was a fan of pre-1931 AJS products and owned a Cammy AJS and an AJS car which he drove in the 2016 Bay to Birdwood. Rob entered the Banbury Run in the UK, and through a friend there was able to ride an AJS in it.

On Veteran and Vintage club rides he would ride his 1924 SV AJS and his 1929 Cammy AJS (after his restoration of that bike was completed). Rob loved speed and his riding skill on 1920s era AJS bikes was legendary. He would set a pace on these bikes that more modern bikes with younger riders would often have trouble keeping up with. He won the Combined Aged and Motorcycle Trophy a record 17 times and the Rallyist of the Year trophy 13 times.

Rob Elliott penned this obituary on our late Cub Member - Robert Smyth—Life Member.

Six riders out of a field of 25 came through the cruellest test of 'The Advertiser' 36-hour Jubi-

lee endurance contest, which ended at the Torrent Parade Ground yesterday.

Of the six to finish four solo .riders and two outfits? 'none got through with a clean sheet, but last night the likely winner was L. Fred ricks (Norton).

The winner will receive £25 from Advertiser Newspapers, Ltd.. and a Commonwealth Jubilee trophy. Motor cycle traders have given £36 to be distributed between placegetters and class winners..

The BSA No. 1 team, R.E. Ophel and K. Darwin, (outfits) is named as the provisional winner of the trade team competition, with the AJS team. D. J. Powell and M. K. Wright (solos) seeded.

They were the only trade teams to finish.

The sixth competitor to finish the course was O. Darwin.

Rain, Mitt, Mud

The 825-mile course, which kept to unmade roads as much as possible, was in shocking condition, with driving rain, mist, foot-deep mud and tricky turns preventing riders from relaxing.

The worst part was a long hill near Ashboume, which reduced the morning's field from nine to six.

F. C. Gallery (Panther, who had been riding wen ran into trouble going on the hill, and reached the top 2 minutes after the time limit. Mr F Smith (Jawa) was forced to retire with chain and mechanical faults.

At least three of the six to climb the hill had to push their machines up the final stag and ail lost points, L Fredericks lost one point when he rode past a control point and had to re turn to check in 59 Minutes late.

The Ashbourne hill put K. Darwin a long way behind time. He checked in at Victor Harbor 59 minutes late —a minute inside the time limit He had made up about halt of this loss by the time he reached Port Noarlunga.

G. Darwin was held up near Aidinga with water in its carburettor, but got going in time to escape disqualification. competitors were seriously insured, although most had more than one spill. An appeal to all competitors who did not complete the course to return their watch tins was made by the MCC of SA last night.





In 1906 Ernest Radnall chose to inject gasoline into his passion for bicycles and thus created the first Radco motorcycle using a 247cc engine built by Ernest himself.

By 1910 the E.A. Radnall Company was manufacturing bicycles, bicycle accessories, motorcycles and motorcycle components; the latter for many of Great Britain's best-known motorcycle manufacturers such as Norton, BSA, Matchless, AJS, Triumph and Royal Enfield.

Motorcycles of up to 650cc were manufactured under the Radco banner until, according to Ernest's grandson Peter, pressure from the very manufacturers his grandfather supplied, the impact of the great depression and demands placed on the business by the impending war effort put an end to Radco motorcycle production in the mid 1930's; but not before Ernest Radnall and his Radco motorcycles managed to accrue a number of records in both closed circuit racing and trials competition.

Today the Radco motorcycle brand is represented at the UK National Motorcycle Museum in West Midlands.


Seeing the photos about <u>Theo Bachmann</u> in the SS reminded me of a visit I had many years ago. A work colleague told me that a gentleman in his street had some old motorcycles, being interested I paid "Theo Bachmann" a visit.

He welcomed me and I found out that he had been a motorcyclist from the early days. In his shed he had a late 1920s scout outfit and a 1924 Chief outfit, he had apparently been a plumber in his working days and rode the scout with a side box when going to jobs . I seem to recall that he told me that the firm he worked for gave it to him when he retired.

He went to a cupboard opened a draw and took out a very early little twin Indian motor all wrapped up in cloth, I see in the photos He was riding a very early Indian, it may have been the motor from that bike. We walked down the back yard and he pointed to a garden bed and told me that he had buried some very early frames there as the only way to get rid of rubbish, was to bury it.

To best of my knowledge Theo was not a member of the VVMC however his son Charlie and nephew Ted became members. I think Ted ended up with the machines etc. Some years later I was telling Ted the burial story and as a result we paid a visit to the house with a metal detector, we dug up the bed that I thought was the one he pointed to and surveyed the whole yard with the metal detector but alas we did not find any old parts of any description.

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
