To handle the cycle and motorcycle business, William Cornell established a second business in Hyde Street shown here in 1915, when he secured the Big X' agency for Ignaz Schwinn's American Excelsior motorcycles. They were replaced by the more popular Harley Davidson. The make of car is not known.

## Early Motoring in South Australia

#### WILLIAM CORNELL (1856-1919) - LENROCS

William Cornell arrived in South Australia in 1877, and established a tobacconist store, first in North Adelaide, then in Rundle Street, named 'Havana House'. When the cycling phenomonen boomed, he commenced importing, and established a second shop in Hyde Street. Both businesses were consolidated in a four storey building in Pirie Street in 1914, when Harley Davidson motorcycles were imported.

He was an early car owner, with a 1904 Rambler (p.98) and a 1904 6 hp De Dionpowered Speedwell. He then bought a 10hp two cylinder Speedwell powered by a 'Volta' motor, which survives (p.106). The French Speedwell was built by Lacoste & Battmann using proprietary motors, while there was also an American make by that name. The January 22 edition of 'The Observer' carried the story that 'In the course of a few days a consignment of the 1916 Excelsior big twin 7/9hp will be landed by Messers W Cornell Ltd of Pirie Street. 'The firm has received a shipment of the 1916 Bradbury



single cylinder, both fixed engine and three speed countershaft gear models. As well as the James machine, 4½hp, combined solo and sidecar, fitted with three speed countershaft chain drive.

Sons Frederick, Clifford and Leonard were Directors, but Frederick (p.26) seems to have taken the lead, becoming a very wealthy business leader. He bought the mansion 'Strathspey' (p.98) in the 1930's, then moved interstate.

In 1924 Cornells established 'Lenrocs' motor house, perhaps the most successful of the time. Agencies were secured for various carburettors, speedometers and magnetos, and Lenrocs became the service centre in Adelaide for



Lenroc's building on the south side of Flinders street in 1924. They later expanded to the west to deal with used cars.

## The 140 year history of the British Motorcycle Industry

I was quite surprised to learn that the origins of the British motorcycle industry date back 140 years to 1884 when the first commercial design for a self-propelled bicycle was created by Englishman, Edward Butler. The Butler Petrol Cycle was a three-wheeled design, powered by a 600cc engine that generated 0.6 bhp. First shown at the 1885 International Inventions Exhibition in London, it failed to become commercially successful as Butler could not secure sufficient funding.

Nearly ten years later in 1893 an American, Edward Joel Pennington was credited with coining the term "motor cycle" when he established the Motor Cycle Company of Cleveland, Ohio, which owned the rights to that first patent. The following year he persuaded C. B. Hitchcock, a successful wagonmaker to produce a prototype based on his design. It, like most of Pennington's subsequent business ventures, was a complete failure with the prototype unable to travel a short distance before its engine would overheat and seize.

During the same period back in the England a fledgling Motor industry was beginning to evolve, mostly in the Midlands around Coventry and Birmingham with names familiar to most of us beginning to produce motorcycles. For example:

- In 1896, the Excelsior Motor Company commenced production of the first publicly available motorcycle.
- Five years later Royal Enfield produced their first motorcycle with a 239cc engine using a belt drive rear wheel.
- In 1902 Norton produced its first motorcycle with bought in engines until it built its own in 1908.
   Norton became, and still remains, one of the longterm stars of the British Motorcycle industry, despite being re-incarnated on more than one occasion.
- It was also in 1902 that Triumph, which had been developing their first motorcycle since 1898 began production. From this slow start Triumph quickly became the largest UK motorcycle manufacturer, producing 500 units annually by 1903. In 1915, the Model H, also known as the 'Trusty Triumph', was widely regarded as the world's first modern motorcycle. With a three-speed gearbox and belt drive, this 550cc model set the stage for the motor cycle as we know it today.
- BSA (Birmingham Small Arms), another very well-known name eventually joined the rapidly expanding list of manufacturers in 1910.
   They remained a leading light in the industry for 63 years until ceasing production in 1973.

   Following other British motor industry names, they have recently begun production under Indian ownership with plans to once again build an updated retro styled BSA Goldstar in England.
- In 1919 George Brough started producing the 32

Brough Superior, made famous by its association with T.E. Lawrence (Lawrence of Arabia), and known as the "Rolls Royce" of motorcycles. The most iconic Brough, the SS100, first appeared in 1924 and stayed in production until 1940. The Brough name didn't disappear as the rights to the name were acquired in 2008 and a prototype of a new SS100 was created. A new range of Brough motorcycles continues in production today but built in France rather than in the UK.

 Through the 1930s and 1940s the industry continued to grow as around 80 more names were added to the list of UK based motorcycle manufacturers. Some sprung up and quickly disappeared, but many remained well established until World War II intervened.

The years immediately before, during and after World War II created substantial demand for motorcycles designed for military use. The larger manufacturers including BSA, Norton, Triumph and Royal Enfield switched production to motor cycles needed by the armed forces. Among the best known are the BSA M20 and Royal Enfield's lightweight 125 cc model designed to be dropped from an aircraft in its parachute-fitted tube cage. The officially titled Royal Enfield WD/RE is best known by its nickname, 'The Flying Flea'. In 1951 BSA purchased Triumph creating the world's largest motorcycle manufacturer with around 25% of worldwide production until Honda overtook them in 1959.

British motorcycling culture thrived through the 1950s as motorcycles became an affordable mode of transport, more so than cars. Best engines were paired with best handling frames to create a Café Racer such as the Triton consisting of a Triumph engine in a Norton Featherbed frame. These were the superbikes of the early 60s, designed to maximise performance and handling by sacrificing practicality and comfort, creating an iconic type of motorcycle that is both admired and built today. From the 1960s onwards British dominance of the industry began its decline and eventually faded away by the 1970s. Alongside the growth of the post war British motorcycles industry British riders were standing out on the world motorsport stage. Starting with Leslie Graham who won the first 500cc World Championship in 1949, followed by Geoff Duke with

with 350cc and 500cc World Championship titles in 1951. Repeating success he won the 350cc class the following year, followed by three consecutive 500cc titles, between 1953 and 1955

John Surtees won the 500cc title in 1956, then dominated both the 350cc and 500cc championships by winning both titles for three years in a row, from 1958 to 1960. Not to be outdone Mike Hailwood became the first man to win three Isle of Man TT titles in one week in 1961. He was also the first rider to win four consecutive 500cc World Championships, between 1962 and 1965. Whilst both John Surtees and Mike Hailwood started their motorsport careers riding British made bikes most of their successes were achieved on other manufacturers machines as the likes of Norton Manx were no longer competitive by the mid 1950's.

British riders did however continue to achieve World Championships successes throughout the 70s, with Phi Read winning the 500cc title in 1973 and 1974 along with four 250cc titles in 1964, 1965, 1968 and 1971. He complemented these GP results with eight TT wins in his career. Following behind Phil Read was Barry Sheene, the last of the British Grand Prix Legends. He won consecutive 500cc Championships in 1976 and 1977 and remains the last British rider to win the premier class title.

Triumph became the exception when in 1983 it was purchased by John Bloor remaining under British ownership. The Triumph success story inspired interest in other British motorcycle brands, perhaps initiating the beginning of a second golden age for British motorcycles. The Norton name attempted to emulate Triumph's success story with a range of completely new sport bikes and in 2021 Mahindra brought the BSA name back with a retro design bike under the iconic Gold Star name. The Rolls Royce of motorcycles has also come back to life. Brough Superior is back in production with an extremely expensive range of retro-modern styles designed and built by Thierry Henriette.

### THE GROWTH OF THE VETERAN & VINTAGE MOVEMENT IN SOUTH AUSTRALIA.

As with all clubs there has to be a beginning and our club was no exception as the Vintage movement was starting to make itself felt back in 1934 when the Motor Cycle Club of S.A., staged the "Old Crocks" run to Glenelg. Of the riders that took part in this rally W.Woollatt is the only one that is still connected with the Club, and with his vast store of knowledge he is an asset to this Club. Several of the machines that were ridden are now in possession of present day club members, one in particular is the 1910 A.J.S., which was ridden by Arnold Hansen and is now owned by W.Woollatt, this bike is a first year production model.

These early rallies had their problems with men and machines as one gent (dressed as girl) had his skirt removed by the belt of 1910 Triumph. It was at the ("Halfway" control that the Peugot forecar crew of Jack Moyle and J. Dineenn (Pass.) had theirminor problem, it appears that in the rush to check in at the front bar they left the ignition switched on and as the journey was about to be resumed the passenger one Mr. J. Dineenn carefully placed himself at the accident and of the Forecar whereupon someone gave the unit a push - the Peugot immediately fired up and headed for the horse trough, the sudden stop at the drinking place ejected said passenger head first

into the murky depths.

After this rally there were several outings- usually combined with It was not until 1956 that a band of one of the car clubs. enthusiasts got together and formed this club. The first meeting was held on 29.11.56 at Mr. P.Ziegler's home. The first committee then elected with J.B. Haines-President; M.A.Lower -Secretary, The first committee was B.L. Mohen-Tressurer, H.P.Rosenhein - Technical Adviser.

It was at this meeting that the name The Veteran & Vintage Motor

Cycle Club of South Australia was accepted.

The meetings were held at various members homes for some time before the Club acquired rooms at Hanson Street, Adelaide, these early meetings brought forth the club spirit- that is still with us today. The minutes of the meeting July 1957 state that Mr.J.A.Kaines donated a work bench to be placed in the garage of Mr.H.Rosenhein for the use of club members.

It was at the September 1957 meeting that the first rally was discussed, the minutes do not state when and where the rally was to be held, but it apparently was held; because at the meeting on 12/11/57 Mr. H. Rosenhein showed colour movies of the Relly. meeting of 4/2/58.decided that machines would be registered with the club using the number plate that we still use now. It was at this meeting that Mr. W. Woollatt first showed himself as a visitor, also the members agreed to hold a rally to Clarendon on the 30/3/58 with 35 machines that were entered on that night.

At this time the Club was meeting in the rooms of the Vintage

Sports Car Club.

By August of 1958 the Club was starting to interest itself in rallies and displays as the meeting discussed a rally to Kadina in March 1959, and a display on October 1958.

At nearly every meeting now rallies were being suggested and discussed as the meeting on 7/10/58 received entries for a two day rally to Victor Harbour on the 15/16 November.

The A.G.M. for 1958 was held on 2nd December with Mr. Woollatt

being elected President for his first of a 10 year period.

The first meeting in 1959 saw more of the Club Spirit with several members making a donation toward the purchase of a "Loud-hailer" for use on rellies. During 1959 the Club was in the upgrade going from strength to strength with new members at the majority of meetings and a bigger envolvement with rallies and other Clubs.

By May 1959- the constitution had been completed and accepted by all members, so that now the club has become an incorporated body and the A.G.M. will now be held at the July meetings.

The Rellys and displays were becoming regular events by 1960/61

with 8 events listed at the August 1960 meeting.

By 1963 the Club had shifted to ne club-rooms at Stanley Street, North Adelaide, where the meetings are still held to this day.

In the Financial report of November 1964 the Club could boast of a

bank balance of Credit £275-10-5, with 48 financial members.

The Club has continued to grow at a sizeable rate until to-day we have 125 members, making this the major Club of its type in the Southern Hemisphere and a club of which every member past & present can be rightly proud.







#### 2024—Ariel Register Rally.

The annual <u>Australian Ariel Register Rally</u> was held this year from April 1 to 4, on South Australia's Fleurieu Peninsula and head-quartered at Goolwa.

The weather didn't disappoint nor did the number of register members with the eastern regions of Qld, NSW, ACT and Vic well represented along with a healthy South Australian contingent. Additional to the members, an impressive array of Vintage and Classic Ariels ranging from a 1926 Model D through various pre-war models including VB, LF and Red Hunter as well as post-war VH , KH twin and 4G/Mk1/2 Square Four up to 1957 were also represented.



Day 1 Friday: After setting up camp (or checking into the park's cabins for some) at the Goolwa Holiday Park, we enjoyed a brisk afternoon shakedown ride to the Finnis General Store near Currency Creek. This gave everyone an opportunity to open up some throttles as well as catch up from last year's event at Ulverstone, Tasmania.

Day 2 Saturday: Rally leader David Long briefed the group at 9am and we headed to Strathalbyn for morning tea via Currency Creek and Ashbourne encounteringing a bit of drizzle on the way. An excellent display of bikes took over the car park of the Strathalbyn Railway Station.

After sufficient caffeine, baked goods and discussion about some foibles plaguing the McClue 27 Model E, we headed via Milang, Clayton and Goolwa to the Murray Mouth lunch stop on Hindmarsh Island.

In glorious sunshine, this location also served as the venue for the show and shine judging.
