

Machines in this rally have been graded according to their age and speed capabilities.

The older and slower machines will depart from the start, and from the control point before the faster machines. Machines will be despatched at minute intervals.

Gilbert M Ralph, MBE, OAM, joined Western Mining Corporation (WMC) as a Design Engineer in Kalgoorlie in 1962. This commenced his 42 year career with WMC in Kalgoorlie, Perth and Melbourne. During the 1970s he was involved in the management of WMC's gold operations. He was transferred to WMC's Melbourne office in 1980 and was responsible for producing the company's annual reports and other publications before retiring in 1994. In his retirement he was a publications consultant to a number of mining companies and wrote technical reports, collated histories of many entities and wrote 450 biographical sketches of notable mining people. In 1979 Gilbert was awarded an MBE for his role as Chairman of the Arts and Entertainment Committee of Western Australia's 150th Anniversary Celebrations and in 2005 an OAM for his contribution to the collation and recording of Australian mining history.

FAVOURITE


W.H. (Bill) Smith sold Favourite motorcycles at Peterborough, in South Australia. Little is known about his motorcycle activities, but at least three Favourite motorcycles survive.

The first, from about 1915, uses a JAP twin engine; the second, from about 1920, uses a 6 hp JAP twin engine and Sturmey Archer CS gearbox; the third, from about

1921, uses an AKD 3 hp single-cylinder engine (fixed belt drive). All three have frames made from Sun components and Druid forks and are likely to have been built by James Hill & Sons in Adelaide, for Bill Smith.

 JAP machines sold by Bill Smith of Peterborough.

 6 H.I. Discovered only a few miles away at Yongala,

 this elongated model is ridden by Gilbert Ralph.
- 101. Triumph Ridden by Jack Kaines, this is a W.D. model as supplied to the Eritish Army.
- JAP Ridden by Merv. Walter is a beautifully 3½ H.P. restored model of a once famous make.
- 106. A.J.S. and sidecar, ridden by Ralph Datlen. This is 6 H.P. a de-luxe model, with electric lighting, and plenty of power.
- 128. Excelsior This racing Brooklands model, ridden by Glen 2½ H.P. Jamieson, the well known Alvis exponent, gained a number of Australian speed records when cwned and ridden by Wally Woollatt. Some of these records are still standing.
- 127. Triumph Ridden by Don Edwards, is very similar to the machine ridden by Jack Kaines, who is the owner of both.
- Is an example of the machine which was the world's biggest seller at that time. The restoration was performed by its rider, Jack 1925

 Foot.

Brian, Interested in Daryl's article in the *Victorian Veteran Car Magazine* about photos contributed to your Club by Gilbert Ralph, has to be the same Gilbert Ralph who rode a c.1916 Favourite JAP motorcycle here in SA.

From my homework it seems that he rode it first to Victor Harbor on the weekend 15-16 November 1958, then in subsequent VVMCCSA events.

I was 14 at the time, rode my pushbike to the rally starts. 'The Favourite' motorcycles were assembled at Peterborough in SA by a Bill Smith between 1914 and 1921, first called 'The Burg' then 'The Favourite' when hostilities commenced.

An early photo shows its registration number 12106, issued to C P O'Dea at Parnaroo in August 1918. Gilbert probably can tell us a whole lot more and maybe has more photos.

A few years ago I re-assembled a c.1915 Favourite Precision single for the Nat Motor Museum, on display there.



There is consequently an alteration necessary in S.24 of the Constitution.

Order of Business para (g) which reads: At Annual General Meetings the old Committee shall retire, and the new Committee be elected according to customary practice.

Proposed: - (g) At an Annual General Meeting:

- (i) the old Committee shall retire and the new Committee be elected.
- (ii) Any proposals for Life Membership shall be heard in accordance with S.7 (a).

Alteration as follows is proposed to S.5 Admission to Membership (a) The name, etc..... fees.





The Square Four is a well-known model used by most Australian police forces, including SA.

The motor — featuring four

cylinders (on two separate crank-shafts) packed together in a square, is so lightly stressed it produces only 30 kW, enough though to take the very stable machine to 170 km/h.


With its 23-litre fuel tank (and a 41-litre oil tank) it made a glorious touring bike with its almost-flat handlebars and sporty

riding position.
Graeme Tremellen, vice-president of the Classic Owners MCC, was a lucky man when he acquired the Ariel of the Ariel — it was sitting under a tree at Gawler being used as a fowl's perch.

fowl's perch.

He put in some fuel and a battery — and it went!

Not everyone in the old-bike
game is as lucky, but the real

problem can be tracking down the bikes and then persuading the owner to part with them.

Like others who know the Square Fours, Graeme Tremellen says it was a fallacy, probably fanned by the opposition at the time that the rear cylinders of the motor seized from lack of cooling air.

An air tunnel scoops air from the front and directs it around the rear cylinders. The two bikes show the pro-

gress made in engineering and efficiency.

Sidecars will take a bigger part at the show than in previous vears.

Other makes represented include Norton, Triumph, Rudge, Harley Davidson, Douglas, AJS, Levis, Moto Guzzi, Tilbrook, MV Agusta, Vincent-HRD, BSA, Indian, Maico. Sunbeam, Matchless, Greeves, Velocette, BMW and Ducati.

The show will be open from 7 p.m. to 10.30 p.m. today; 11 a.m. to 11 p.m. tomorrow and Sunday and 11 a.m. to 6 p.m.


