

Joining FOMSA

The goal of the Festival of Motorcycling SA (FOMSA) from its inception, has been to build stronger relationships between South Australian motorcycle clubs. FOMSA has now formalised its structure by Incorporation as a non-profit organisation and strengthened its collaboration tools by creating "Affiliated Club" membership.

There are now several affiliated clubs, including The Vintage and Veteran Motorcycle Club of SA, The Vincent Owners Club, The Classic Owners Motorcycle Club of SA, The Northern Yorke Peninsula Motorcycle Club and the Levis Motorcycle Club, with more clubs joining every month. The advantages of Affiliation are the sharing of club event calendars on the FOMSA website, links to clubs webpage, club logos posted on the FOMSA homepage increasing the profile of the club and consequently might lead to additional club membership and thus income. The sharing of calendars across the affiliated clubs helps reduce the likelihood of event clashes. Affiliation only costs \$10 per annum. An added benefit is doing something good for the community by helping fund medical research in SA. Affiliated clubs also get priority






Riders Who Finished With Full Points In 24-Hour Trial

RACQ Motorfest 2024

Sunday the 16th June saw over 500 vehicles and 10,000 people attend this year's Royal Automobile Club of Queensland Motorfest at the Brisbane Exhibition grounds. The show covers all forms of motorised transport from the earliest to current with profits going to the RACQ Foundation which assists people after natural disasters. The Brisbane area of the HMCCQ set up a display of around ten amazing motorcycles in the John Reid Pavilion that were very well received by the public with 2025 Calendars selling like hot cakes. I wasn't aware of their display so entered solo on my 1954 MV Agusta 175 CSS. Sadly, there were only a couple of other bikes entered but the good news was that I got to park in the main arena with the cars and trucks. With wonderful weather and some amazing machines it was a day full of activities including live music in the afternoon.

The RACQ presented awards on the day for several categories. The Veteran and Vintage categories

combined motorcycles with 4-wheelers. Bailey Rowe received an honourable mention for his 1916 Rover in the Veteran Category and another honourable mention for his 1929 Norton in the Veteran Category. I was fortunate to win the motorcycle category with Garrin Angel receiving an honourable mention for his 1925 Indian Scout. The day ended with a cavalcade where the general public were invited to line the footpaths as all the exhibitors exited the venue in single file. Everyone had their smart phone out capturing the entourage which topped off a wonderful day for all.



FOMSA Swapmeet a success

The inaugural FOMsa Undercover Winter Swap Meet, for motorcycles-only has received only good reports from everyone, with 45 sellers and 350 buyers coming through the doors. The weather was glorious so the undercover aspect of the event was superfluous, but in Adelaide it could have just as likely been pouring with rain in late June. Many attendees moved into McQueen's Tavern next door afterwards to talk about the bargains they bought or the money they made.

The sellers' stalls offered a huge variety of motorcycles and parts for sale, everything from a late model Buell to a pair of veteran motorcycles owned by the same family since the turn of last century. In Peter of Adelaide's words (after the swapmeet) "thanks for your interest in my Great Grandfather Henry's motorcycles, I don't know much about them other than that he was a farmer on the Yorke Peninsula here in South Australia and he would have used them for everyday stuff until they broke and when he couldn't fix them anymore, they got parked and left, no one but me has had any interest in motorcycles since. They were stored in a shed or barn since about the late teens I think."

The stall-holders included many swapmeet regulars as well as the Club displays put on by FOMsa 'Affiliated Clubs'. Other regular FOMsa event participants were also invited to have a site for free to increase the variety of stalls and the interest for the buyers. The St John Ambulance Museum, for example, displayed their historic motorcycle outfit, which was used in the 'fifties and 'sixties to provide first aid at speedway events in Adelaide, such as Rowley Park. Space was at a premium, but Miranda and Mark Howson, both FOMsa Committee members, did a terrific job of providing traffic direction and will be looking at ways to lay things out and manage things differently for next year's winter swapmeet.

FOMsa would like to thank the staff and management of Greyhound Racing South Australia for their support. It is our goal to improve the experience for everyone for next year's Undercover Winter Swapmeet, so stay in touch via the FOMsa website for the announcement.

Historical Motorcycle Club Queensland Veteran Rally, Ivory's Rock. Sat, 17 Aug 2024

It all started innocently enough. Mark Gascoigne, his 1914 Rudge Multi and 1914 run and jump Triumph and Matt Wright with his 1918 Harley loaded on the trailer left Melbourne the Friday before the rally. I joined them that morning driving my Hyundai van with my 1913 Rudge Multi on board. Now Melbourne to Brisbane is not a short journey to be taken lightly. Equivalent of London to Moscow. Making good time we pulled into Thurgoona shopping centre just north of Albury at lunchtime to murder a pie at the local bakery and that is when the adventure started. In preparation for the rally before I left home, I had done the right thing and had a new battery and clutch fitted to my van. The only problem we were later to learn was that when reinstalling the gearbox, the mechanic has smashed the needle roller spigot bearing in the flywheel with the gearbox input shaft. The bearing subsequently collapsed and the clutch would not release. Three and a half hours lost while waiting for roadside assist and finally a tow truck was organised. The plan was for the van to be fixed locally and I minus my bike would continue with Matt and Mark. The brilliantly planned tour was by now starting to resembling an episode of the Wacky Races. Matt's car by now is definitely up near its maximum taxi weight and we set a course for Parkes but didn't roll into our accommodation till 11pm.

Saturday night we stopped in Armidale which lived up to its reputation of being one of the cooler towns in Australia. The next morning the car was covered in ice and the reverse cycle air conditioner wasn't having anything to do with warming our cabin. So we made a hasty exit and arrived at rally headquarters at Peaks Crossing mid Sunday afternoon. It is about 10 minutes south of Ipswich and yes, we did subsequently see Pauline's fish and chip shop. The site was a huge facility that you could hold a national scout jamboree at with no problem. Our rally probably used 10% of the facilities. There was something like 27kms of roads and tracks within the property. Immediately adjacent was the stunning backdrop of Ivory's Rock. The original ingenious plan was that I would camp in my van with my fold up stretcher and swag but now was sans van. We had booked 2 small cabins with their own en-suite and floor space for a camp stretcher was limited. The solution was that the stretcher ended up in the ensuite. Comfort improved hugely when one of the rally entrants went home a couple of nights early and I got my own cabin and didn't have to sleep with my head in the shower.

The rally itself set the gold standard in organisation and execution. This was thanks to a clearly gifted organiser Doug Joliffe. Three evening meals and morning teas were supplied and for all the other meals a catering truck was on site. If you were lazy enough, they were even doing bacon and egg rolls for breakfast with coffee. Every day on the rally there was happy hour with free beer and wine between 5 and 6 which rolled into dinner. On top of that we felt we were treated like royalty having come so far. It was too good to be true but it was true.

The rally itself was attended by 44 bikes and about 60 people all up. This was pretty impressive when every bike had to be made before 1919. Fellow club members Ian and Jenny Sargent were also on the rally. We toured every day in what is known as the scenic rim. A basin of probably 40-50 kms in diameter 360 degrees surrounded by hills in very pretty country. A stand out excursion after the shake down rally on the first day was the Ipswich Rail Museum. What has this to do with veteran bikes? Everything. Because one of the club members had donated an unrestored Spencer motorcycle to the museum. The museum then got the club members to restore the bike which is in its own room behind glass. It is believed to be the first Australian made motorcycle. Mr Spencer had been a contractor to the railway workshops hence the connection. It is believed that a dozen motorcycles were made and only 2 survived.

The organised morning teas were sumptuous and miraculously all food was hastily devoured. One was at a primary school and the others at 2 CWA halls. Being the first to arrive at one morning tea I walked into the room and saw a mountain of food on the tables and exclaimed 'What are you trying to do to us?'. Another really good thing was the Facebook group created well before the rally. This was informative and entertaining. We had a very good idea of who was coming with what and how it was all organised. This is still going and photos and videos some with drone footage have been uploaded for all to see. We had a good time. Next one in 2 year's time. Like McArthur we will return.


