




Lions Bike Show - Sunday November 3rd

The Cressy

Once upon a time.....our old mate Len Masser who was an Honorary Life Member of the VCC of NSW and also an Honorary Life Member of the VMCC NSW rang up one morning and asked if I could take him over to the mechanic that serviced his Mercedes over at Kingswood "no problem Len" was my answer.

I picked him up at his home in Kingswood and off we went to his mechanic, whilst Len was supervising the work the conversation turned to veteran cars (Len was a real De Dion expert having owned and restored a 1901 and 1906 model from wrecked remains)....his mechanic said take a look in the factory unit next door there is dozens of em".

Len lost interest in the Merc and off we trotted to peer into the roller door which was right up allowing full vision of exactly what the mechanic had told us seconds earlier! The Sun behind us cast fairly long shadows and as we walked through the roller door a chap was busy buffing up a 1950 grey Bentley, he looked up after seeing our shadow and placed the buff on the floor and started to walk over to us saying "NO NO guys this is a private...that's as much as he got out before Len said "Len Masser Veteran Car Club".

The guy smiled and said "Ah Len you don't know me but I sure have heard your name enough, pleased to meet you"

We were in! First car we spotted was a 1914 Argyle with Sleeve Valve engine followed by a veteran Rolls Royce behind it....Len was in his element. I quickly blurted out "Any motorcycles" and the chap said "no not interested in em" and after saying that I immediately spotted a lovely little Moto Reve V twin engine under the

bench...."what about that then" he came back with "Didn't know it was there".

The factory had been a brick works in an earlier life and bolted to its walls were heavy racking, I could see the rear belt drive wheel off a motorcycle jutting out from above one of the racks....same conversation followed again, this time I took the initiative to be one step in front of him and started to climb the racking getting covered in heavy dust of the worse kind. It wasn't only a rear wheel but frame, forks, handlebars, seat and other bits including riveted to the steering head was a lovely nickel plated makers badge declaring "CRESSY Whatley's Cycles" I was onto a diamond in the rough.



No amount of haggling could buy the remains on the day unfortunately and in fact it took years before I could call it mine after finding enough veteran car "jewellery" to effect a swap. Happily I included the Moto Reve engine in the deal.



Almost immediately after spotting the Cressy remains I rang my old mate David Moore who was and still is the Secretary of the VMCCT and asked him what he knew about a Cressy motorcycle....I

could sense he was green with envy on the other end of the phone. Of course he was the man who had made a study of Tasmanian made motorcycles for years spending countless nights in the archives researching them.

Dave was able to tell me only three existed on the Tassie registration records and one of them was a "Cressy-JAP"..... mine is a CressyPrecision with 3 1/2HP engine. The registration records revealed machines had been made in 1915, 1917 and 1919.....and gave me the details of each registration including owners names and address's. I have the details still in a diary from the year.

Shortly after Telecom brought out a deal were you could call any number in Australia after 7.00pm for a maximum of \$2 so I sat down one night and called Directory Assistance and asked for every phone number of anyone with one of the surnames Dave had given me within 25 miles of Cressy....one surname came up trumps with the Cressy owners Grandson's wife on the other end of the line saying "Oh that's interesting we have just moved into my Husbands Grandfathers old property and I have been looking through old photo albums to get an idea of what the gardens looked like back in the day?

I asked if I could call back in a month or two to see if she had come across any photos of a motorcycle, this I did but I must have caught her on a bad day because she almost brushed me off with showing no interest unfortunately. It was many years later I again rang the number and again this time was told to get back to her some other time.



When I did the deal to secure the Cressy I asked if he knew any history of the bike and he told me the family had relatives in Longford and that as kids his family had spent a couple of weeks visiting the rellies....his father who was the veteran car collector had asked the local postman if he knew of any very old cars in the district and that he would give a couple of quid reward for info leading to the purchase of a car, the postman had replied "what about motorcycles" 10 shillings for one of them was the answer.

The bike was pushed back in the shed and forgotten until a move to our new abode in Blackmans Bay Heights recently when it saw the light of day again.

I picked up a Cressy cycle from an antique shop in New Norfolk about 7 years ago to complement it.



Although Earl has been com-peting only in scrambles and trials in recent years, he has had considerable experience in high speed work. Back in 1936 he was first home with a 500 c.c. machine in the Centenary TT at Victor Harbor and has also raced at Sellick's. His bal-ancing acts with Jack Cranwell have been staged for many years, and he immediately linked up with the Motor Cyc-lists' Circus when it was formed. Machine preparation and

Machine preparation and tuning has also been mastered by this versatile motor cyclist, who acted as tuner for "Judge" Rutherford when he was the

Rutherford when he was the idol of Camden motordrome. Bence Miller was also a com-petitor in the Centenary TT at Victor in 1936, and in the same year won the Levis Club's Side-car Championship at Sellick's.

Tyres: 25 x 3" Dunlop Cord Balloon, giving enceptional comfort. Tank: Welded steel; saddle type; supported on rubber shock absorbing buffers; large filler caps; handsome and refined appearance; exceptionally durable finism; capacity: 14 gallons petrol and 3 pints oil.






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The Oxenberry Winery Rally and sausage sizzle will commence at 10am on Sunday 20th October 2024, from the Oxenberry Winery on Kangarilla Road, McLaren Vale.

Oxenberry is located on the outskirts of McLaren Vale and IS NOT the Scarpantoni Winery at McLaren Flat.

Participants should gather and line the bikes up prior to the rally. Vehicles and trailers will be directed to **park against the west side of the carpark** to please leave the car park free for winery visitors in our absence.

The rally will depart Oxenberry And head towards McLaren Flat, turning into Oakley Road to climb Pennys Hill Road, along Range Road to turn into Brookmans Road. We then ride along Brookman Road, turning right into onto Proctor Road traversing dairy country through Yundi to Nangakita. Then we head out through Mount Compass, a short ride down the Victor Harbor Road, onto the Cleland Valley Road to Bull Creek Road, Goolwa Road, almost to Currency Creek, to wind our way through to Finniss.
