1924 The Motor Cycle Club of South Australia. the Freak Hill Climb at Morialta in 1924 Campbelltown Library post on FaceBook

This week we travel back to 1924 and the excitement of the **Freak Hill Climb at Morialta** hosted by the Motor Cycle Club of South Australia. Thousands of enthusiasts were drawn to witness motorcycle daredevils tackle the rugged hillside.

Charles Moyle set the fastest time of the day, completing the climb in just 15 seconds on a Norton. Close behind was **W.H. Hubbard (pictured)**, timed at 17 seconds on an A.J.S. machine. Hubbard's dramatic finish captivated onlookers with the **Port Pirie Recorder** describing: "In the last 50 yards, his machine was practically steeplechasing up the rugged hillside."

Walter Henry Hubbard wasn't just an accomplished rider; he was a key figure in the motorcycle industry. As sales manager for **Wyatt Motoria in Grenfell Street Adelaide**, he oversaw shipments of British A.J.S. motorcycles.



In May 1924, he accepted a new role as sales manager for **Hub Motors**, the South Australian agents for B.S.A. motorcycles. With hands-on experience across multiple brands and competitive results in reliability and speed competitions dating back to 1916, Mr Hubbard was a well-known and respected figure in Australia's motorcycling scene.

In September 1924, Hub Motors created a standout display at the Adelaide Show. Described by **The Register** as "...one of the most original displays in the show," it featured a charming holiday camping scene—complete with a tent, campfire, billy, gun, fishing rod, and rabbits—all showcased alongside two B.S.A. motorcycles priced at £90 each.

By October 1925, Walter, along with Arthur Hubbard, Thomas George Hubbard, and Charles Bray, took ownership of **Hub Motors Ltd at 136 Currie Street, Adelaide**. Their contributions to South Australia's motor-cycling legacy live on.

The premises of Jack Smith were located in the Main Street of Peterborough post war (WW2) when they were selling the new General Motors products.

Prior to all of this up until WW1 Peterborough had been known as Petersburg and Burg bicycles were sold by W "Bill" H Smith Memorial to W. H. (Bill) Smith, former garage owner and a wounded victim of a shooting at Riverton Station when Percival Stanley Brookfield, M.P. was killed while trying to disarm Koorman Tomayoff, a deranged Russian on 22 March 1921. Smith died on 21 November 1931 and was buried at Peterborough two days later. The photograph is undated.

who was also the Ford agents and as a not so little boy I can remember seeing Model T Fords with W H Smith Dealer badges on the dashboard.

With German names becoming unpopular in 1914 the name of the town was changed to Peterborough and Smith's bicycle and motorcycle brand was changed to The Favourite from "The Burg".

It would appear that most Favourite motorcycles were actually manufactured to Smith's order by James Hill and Son the Adelaide wholesaler of bicycle and motorcycle parts who constructed them .

At least 4 Favourite motorcycles have survived with a single cylinder model in the National Motor Museum at Birdwood.

Unfortunately being successful in business and patriotic did not save W H "Bill " Smith from being wounded at Riverton railway station on 21 March 1921 when Percival Stanley Byfield MP aged 45 a radical socialist politician who opposed conscription was wounded and later died as a result of trying to disarm a deranged Russian Koorman Tomayoff.

Smith however survived his thigh wound and died on 21 November 1931 and has possibly the largest memorial in Peterborough cemetery (See SLSA photo B48878).

October included everything from a Poker Run through the Adelaide Hills to a full 2-day program held at the historic Hart's Mill in Port Adelaide. The "Classics at Hart" weekend included a public display of several hundred motorcycles of all ages and types, open to the public for an entry fee of only a gold coin donation. Classics at Hart was attended by approximately 1,600 visitors over the two days. Everyone enjoyed the excellent Spring weather,



a variety of food and drink vans and the music provided by DJ, Jess Mallia and a live band, the Memphis Sons, who both really engaged the audience and the exhibitors alike. Attendees enjoyed great food and music and the sights and sounds of a range of machines from across the decades.

The bonanza of activities in October was made possible by the team spirit and energy of the affiliated clubs of FOMSA, especially the Classic

Owners, Vintage and Veteran, and Levis clubs. The "59" club have also been supportive with their attendance at events over the last year.

The weekend kicked off on the Saturday morning with a cavalcade parade of motorcycles, cyclecars, sidecars and trikes, which proceeded around the roads on the Lefevre Peninsula and included a long run along the foreshore such

that the entrants enjoyed the view of the beautiful Semaphore foreshore. The lead vehicles of the cavalcade were provided by the SA Police Historic Society; a historic police car, carrying dignitaries and key organisers from the event, and a Police motorcycle.

The Vintage and Veteran motorcycle club of South Australia organised a very interesting and diverse display of Australian-made motorcycles, bicycles and cycle cars. The President Brian Forth is passionate about the local motorcycle history and was the key driver of the display. The vehicle that drew the most attention on the day was the Tilbrook cyclecar, made in Adelaide, owned by Lyndon Tilbrook from Canberra. Lyndon also drove it in the Cavalcade leaving an unmistakeable 2-stroke blue haze in its wake. Motorcycles displayed included a Swastika JAP and an original condition Peerless motorcycle.

There was also a unique South Australian-made motorcycle displayed at the Levis Motorcycle Marquis, a V twin Craig, made in Rundle Street Adelaide in 1915.

In a separate room of the Mill building was the competition Bike display which included a Vincent speedway outfit and several solo machines as well as some modern race bikes and paraphernalia. Additional entertainment in this area was provided by Phil Baughan who got the blood pumping for the race fans with his race bike start-ups.

The Levis Club ran the Show and Shine on the Saturday and did a very professional job of judging the bikes displayed outside the Mill building in Market Square. The task would have been difficult given the quality and quantity of the bikes entered. It was a profitable and enjoyable year marked by the handing over of a cheque for \$12,000 to Hazel Jourdin of SAHMRI (SA Health and Medical Research Institute) on the Saturday morning at the official opening of the event by the Mayor of the Port Adelaide and Enfield Council, Claire Boan, and the president of FOMSA, Lew Hylton. Helmet need replacing?

7 Signs You Need To Replace Your Motorcycle Helmet POSTED ON MAY 5, 2018 BY MOTOHELMET

If you ride your motorcycle or ATV often then your helmet gets a lot of use. At some point you will have to replace it but the question is when?

How long does a motorcycle helmet last? The general rule of thumb is to consider replacing your helmet every 3-5 years barring that the helmet has not experienced any accidents or significant impact. Most manufacturers and safety organizations recommend this especially if you wear your helmet consistently. However, there are a few other signs you should be paying attention to in order to help you determine when it is time to get yourself a new motorcycle helmet.

Do You Need To Replace Your Helmet If You Drop It?

I'm sure you have heard by now that if you drop your helmet you need to replace. Let me clarify any misunderstandings or concerns. Unless you drop it off the Eiffel tower then you don't have to replace your helmet.

Many retailers may insinuate this scare tactic just to get more sales but it is simply not true. If you drop your motorcycle helmet, you do not need to replace it.

Of course, you should check your helmet for any possible damage if you do drop it but chances are you won't need to replace it. You would have to drop your helmet from a significant height in order to damage it to the point that you need a new one.

Motorcycle helmets and ATV helmets alike are very sturdy and robust. The majority of helmets made by today's safety standards can withstand unintentional wear and tear, especially if you purchase one from a reputable manufacturer.

However, this does not mean you should be throwing your helmet around. I recommend keeping good care of your helmet and storing it in a dry, cool area.

Helmet Material

Before we go any further, let's quickly discuss the material a helmet is made from. Taking a look at the materials manufacturers use will help to give you a better understanding of helmet durability. What is a motorcycle helmet made of?

The majority of motorcycle helmets and dirt bike helmets consist of an outer shell made from some type of durable plastic, fiberglass, or carbon. These compounds are some of the most robust materials found on this planet. They will last for years to come.

They are extremely durable and have proof of the utmost resiliency. A simple drop of your helmet onto the ground should not cause it to become damaged if it is made from one of these compounds. The interior helmet typically consists of dense foam to help absorb impact. If you dropped your helmet with something heavy inside of it, you may need to check the foam for deformation. The foam does a great job of absorbing and dispersing impact so dropping your helmet should not drastically impact the integrity of your helmet to the point that you need a new one.

You will also find some type of moisture-wicking lining inside your helmet as well. This lining will help absorb sweat and other moisture to preserve the integrity of the helmet. Unless you are filling your helmet with water and then letting it free fall from your roof, you do not have to worry about getting a new helmet if you accidentally drop it.

Signs You Need A New Helmet

Below I have listed 7 signs to look for that will help determine if you need a new helmet. As a beginner rider, these tips helped me to know if I needed to replace mine.

#1 – Helmet Age

How old is your helmet? Like I mentioned at the beginning of this article, if you have worn your helmet for over 5 years, then it might be time to replace it.

But why should you replace your helmet every 5 years? After 5 years of consistent wear and tear, your helmet will have more than likely weakened. I know it may look like it is in perfect condition but you should consider its age and the impact it has on the components of the helmet.

If you wear your helmet consistently, it becomes exposed to weather, dirt, UV rays, and other elements that you may not think about having an effect on the integrity of your helmet. These elements ultimately weaken the resins and glues that hold it together.

Although there is no definitive research on this, the 5 year age expiration date is enforced by most manufacturers. There are other factors that can play into the lifespan of your helmet. So even though 5 years is the recommended age limit for a replacement, it could be a few years less or more.

The average Shoei helmet lifespan is around 5 years. You can use that as a reference point since they are one of the most reputable brands in the industry. Also, Snell safety standards enforce a 5-year policy. Therefore manufacturers make sure to abide by this to prevent potential lawsuits.

Bob Jones aged 19 first motorcycles just before the accident, well that's another story. He had only just had the BSA for a few weeks when he came off in North Terrace turning into Frome Road, going a little faster than he should have been, and tried to slice a Harley Davidson Outfit in half. Bob ended up in the RAH with a broken nose and his pillion passenger was in hospital for a week.





#2 – Usage

If you wear your helmet every day, it becomes exposed to constant wear and tear. It may not be entirely apparent but consistent use weakens the integrity of your helmet over time.

You can compare it to riding your bike or driving your car every day. As the miles stack up, you need to either perform more maintenance or purchase a new one.

#3 - Have You Been In An Accident?

This should be completely obvious but this fact needs to be mentioned. If you have experienced an accident then it may be time for a new helmet. You need to thoroughly check your helmet and possibly get it x -rayed for any damage.

Wearing a broken helmet will not serve you any protection. I can't stress this enough. Do not wear a helmet that has been in an accident. It is simply not worth your life to save a few dollars.

#4 – Helmet Becomes Loose

When you buy a new helmet it fits very snug. If you turn or shake your head it remains stuck to your noggin like glue.

To determine if your helmet has loosened try this test. Shake your head side-to-side. Does it remain stuck to your head or does it slide around? If your helmet slides around while shaking your head, this means your padding has become compacted and may be time for a replacement. You can also check for indentations in the foam lining.

Your helmet should hug your head firmly. You do not want to be in an accident wearing a loose helmet. Traumatic brain injury has been linked to loose-fitting helmets so make sure yours fits tightly or get a new one.

#5 – Interior Starts Deteriorating

Usually, it is not the outside shell that deteriorates first. It is typically the lining and foam inside of the helmet. If the inside of your helmet starts to flake off into your hair or onto your shoulders, that is a good sign you need a helmet replacement.

Whether this happens after 3 years of use or 5, I would seriously consider purchasing a new helmet. Since the EPS liner is usually painted black, you can also check for tiny white cracks forming inside of your helmet.

If this happens that means the integrity of the helmet is weakening and will not be able to absorb impact effectively. Be mindful if you use hair product as that can assist in deteriorating the insides of your helmet.

#6 - Exterior Start Deteriorating

If the shell of your helmet becomes brittle, has cracks, or begins to fall apart then you need to replace your helmet. I'm hoping this is obvious but just want to make sure that wearing a helmet in this weakened condition is not safe.

The shell is the first point of contact during an accident. Therefore this part should be very strong and durable. Any cracks in the shell will instantly expose your head to injury if you are in an accident.

#7 – Strap or Lock Failure

Have the straps stopped working properly on your helmet? For those of you who wear your helmets often you may notice that your strap locks have become corroded due to weather and dirt.

Your helmet chin strap is a critical component to keeping your helmet on your head. If this part does not work properly then it might be time to buy a new helmet or find a chin strap replacement. Last thoughts

I'm sure you know that your brain is your number one priority when it comes to riding a motorcycle, dirt bike or ATV. Therefore you need a helmet that works.

Your helmet can last a while if your store it properly and perform regular maintenance. You should still

consider the age and usage of your helmet when deciding to buy a new one.

Another reason to buy a new helmet, beyond the normal wear and tear, is the advances in helmet

technology. It seems like every year manufacturers come out with new head protection designs that are better than previous versions.

Another key takeaway you should keep in mind is to never wear a used helmet. It may look fine on the surface but may have hidden cracks in the helmet that can go undetected by the human eye. Post navigation

CUDLEE CREEK BREAKFAST AND RIDE SUNDAY JANUARY 19TH 2025−FROM 9.00AM

Meet at the motorbike friendly Cudlee Creek Tavern, Gorge Rd, Cudlee Creek.

The Tavern is opposite the turn off to the Gorge Wildlife Park about 1.5 kms before the Cudlee Creek township, if coming from Adelaide. There is parking for cars and trailers alongside the Tavern and Caravan Park.

The Buffet style breakfast will be served at 9.00am.

The buffet usually consists of eggs, bacon, sausages, fried tomatoes, baked beans, mushroom, hash browns and pancakes. They do serve up a good meal! After breakfast there will be a choice of 2 ride routes.

The Rides will start at approximately 10.00am.

The Main Route will head DOWN the Gorge Road, with views of the Kangaroo Creek Reservoir, up the Corkscrew, along Montacute Road to Ashton. Then through Summertown to Carey Gully onto Deviation Road, Collins Hill Road, Vickers Road, then via Tiers Road into Woodside. Between Woodside and Lobethal, at the roundabout, is where we join with the Shorter Route bikes, then following through to Gumeracha, down the Gorge Road back to the Tavern.

The Shorter Route, which is more suitable for the Veteran and Tiddler bikes, will go UP the Gorge Road through to Gumeracha, Forreston then via Martin Hill Road, Cromer Road into Birdwood. Then to Mount Torrens, Springhead Road to Charleston and join up with the Main Route riders after turning at the roundabout to Lobethal. We then follow the same course as the Main Route back to the Cudlee Creek.

The distance for the Main Route is about 70kms and about 63kms for the Shorter Route which has a lot less climbs and fewer corners.
