



Original, all parts are the original bike, including the Front Wheel Driven Chronometric Speedo. None of the tinware has been replaced and is in good condition.

Ariel started 1940 model manufacture in September '39. The dating certificate (attached) has this bike leaving the factory on December 5th,1939. The only changes from original are coil ignition, oil cooler (for when the bike had a sidecar) and a separate oil filter.


Our Club 50th Anniversary Tour by Co-ordinator Colin Pauley.



The Limb Motorcycle.

Roused by an article about the Port Pirie motorcycling pioneer Archie Limb, Ian Wilson knew he had to share the story of his prized possession.

Mr Wilson is the proud owner of an original Port Pirie-built Limb motorcycle.

Mr Wilson said it was originally sold to a Mr Gold, who then sold it to Reg McDonald of Crystal Brook about 1910. It was registered as a Limb of 3.5 horsepower.

The registration number in 1916 was SA-6872. Reg McDonald was Mr Wilson's wife's grandfather – he went away to the first world war and the bike was dismantled to avoid paying registration. At the time, all vehicles which were roadworthy had to pay tax.

The motorcycle was in pieces and the frame and tank ended up with a gentleman by the name of Cam Gilbert. He was reportedly going to restore it, but never got around to it. The bike was still in Crystal Brook at that time. In 1975, Mr Wilson discovered the engine in Mr McDonald's shed and he allowed him to restore it. Mr McDonald collected the rusty frame from Cam Gilbert and in 1978 it was in running order. The bike is

a complex machine featuring a single gear with no clutch and lots of controls. Mr Wilson said that many pieces were missing but with the help of the Veteran and Vintage Motorcycle Club and its members he was able to duplicate it. The bike consists of a frame and cycle parts by Chater Lea, a company in England that supplied parts as well as complete motorcycles. The engine is a Fafnir – a Belgium company in no way related to the Fafnir bearing company. It had a low-tension dynamo which supplied current for a trembler coil for the ignition, however Mr Wilson replaced it (because there was nothing there) with a High Tension Magneto. Archibald "Archie" Limb was a master of machinery. He built one of the first motorcycles that was entirely created in Port Pirie in 1903 and it is likely that this very bike was built by hand in his workshop and business Port Pirie Pioneer Cycle and Motor Cycling Works. He bought the business from Mr T. Row in 1898 in partnership with Arnold Low in the early years and is believed to have worked with a Mr Alf Williams later on. Mr Limb wasn't the only one as at least three brands were made - the Limb, the Laver and the Growden. Mr Limb earned a good reputation by reading respective literature of his field to keep his skills up to date and had the latest machinery available. More than 100 years since the motorcycle was made, a remarkable tale of family and friendship lives on.

<u>Blyth Agriculturist 12 January 1923</u> J N Boberg report in the Right Around Australia by Mmotor Cycle. Mr. BOBERG PASSES CLARE.THROUGH

This formidable project has been undertaken by Mr- J. N. Sober*, who arrived in Clare on Sunday evening last from Adelaide, enroute to Perth. Mr. Boberg is travelling as a representative of the Sydney 'Daily Mail,' toward which paper he is contributing a series of articles respecting his travels, as well as pictures taken as he goes through. He has been commissioned to forward specimens obtained on the trip to the Botanical Gardens and Museum, Sydney.

Interviewed at Cadan'e Clare Hotel on Monday morning, Mr Boberg had interesting facts to tell of his journey, which began in Sydney. The type of machine used (riding solo as far as Adelaide) was a 5 6hp Indian Scout. When in Adelaide a Goulding side-car attachment was added. Proceeding to Messrs Vivian Lewis, Limited'? Clare garage, and by the courtesy of Mr. Shaw, our reporter inspected the machine, which appeared to be in first-class condition. Surplus gear is carried in the side-car, but when riding solo strong leather bags strapped to the carrier are used. A tank containing an 8 gallon supply of petrol is also carried, for in case of emergency.

A hardened steel casing protects the front of the engine from flying pebbles, sand, &c , and altogether the outfit looks very light for so huge an undertaking.

A large-sized water-bag completes a most compact and useful travelling kit.

Several onlookers commented upon the very small clearance between the engine

and the roadway, thinking that for such a rough trip more clearance apace was necessary, but Mr. Boberg explained that the steel casing underneath had acted very well up to date. Others expressed the idea that he would have a 'rough bit' in the West Australian sandy country and through the Nullarbor Plain, but with the optimistic spirit of the adventurous, he smiled, and said ' it was on the cards,' but he would have a good try.

Bronzed by the sun and whipped by the wind, this hardy explorer looked the personification of health. Standing about 5 feet 10 inches in height, with a loose wiry frame, we have no doubt that his perseverance and pluck will see him through.

Respecting the roadways so far as he has travelled, Mr Boberg said that from Sydney to Eden (on the Victorian border) the roads were generally good, with a few potholes. From Eden to Genoa (Victoria) they were in a very bad condition, though re-con3truction is now taking place. Genoa to Orbost, roads good little sand in places, Orbost to Lakes Entrance, bad roads ; afterwards splendid track right through to Melbourne. Melbourne to Hamilton, good Casterton to Penola, sandy to Millicent to Kingston, good; Kingston, (Coorong Desert), Meningie, not as bad as imagined or reported ; Meningie to Adelaide, good ; Adelaide to Clare, good, but not equal to parts N S Wales and Victoria, while from Adelaide to Gawler potholes were freely met with.

Questioned when be hoped to arrive in Perth the cyclist said he could not hazard a guess, but 'depend upon it, he would arrive sometime. Wishing him the best of luck, a hearty hand shake, and his cheerful 'cheerio' were the finishing touches to a pleasant interview.

J. N. BOBERG RESUMES HIS JOURNEY.

Two motor cycles and a side car formed the centre of interest for a big crowd of people at Armstrong and Co's garage, Perth, on Monday.

One was an Indian Chief with, a miniature masher cart body attached, and the other was an Indian Scout. The heavy machine was the property of Mr. Jack Higham, of Glenflorrie Station, back from Onslow, and the Scout is the machine that is carrying Mr. J.N. Boberg, the travelling representative of the Sydney "Daily Mail," around Australia.

The two motor cycles presented a unique contrast. Mr. Higham 's mount was new and shining, and the up-to-date sidecar was filled with tins of petrol, spare tyres, supplies and odds and ends. Mr. Boberg 's machine though free from the grimy mass of dirt which it brought to Perth, looked spare and gaunt beside the big Chief and side car. Mr. Higham will accompany Mr. Boberg on the first thousand miles of his journey north. The route will be through Midland Junction, Moora, Pithara, Mullewa, and then on through the different stations, Billabalong, Byro, Dairy Creek, Lynton, Yannarie, and on to Onslow.

Mr. Boberg carries only a spare tube and repair outfit. He takes no food or water with him, and depends on the people he comes across for sustenance. As one spectator of the departure remarked, "Ned Kelly was a game 'un, but he had nothing on this chap."

Mr. Boberg aims to proceed to Roebourne, and then cut inland to Hall's Creek. After that, well, he says he will wait and see. He left a message to the people of W.A. whom he has met thanking them for their kindness which he said had made his journey much easier than it would otherwise have been. Mr. Boberg left Sydney on December on the 9 and in due course hopes to re-turn to that city after driving around the continent. His future plans include the circling of Tasmania and then home.

SCIENTIST, SINGER, AND SPORTSMAN

Mr. W. E. N. Laver Leaving Pirie Had Town's First "Motor Car Wedding" ONE of Pirie's cheeriest personalities, Mr. W. E. N. Laver, of Queen s street, Solomontown, will sever his residential and business connections with the town on October 13, when he will leave for Glenelg.

Mr. Laver has in 32 years' residence experienced good times and some which have not been so bright, and he has smiled through them all, but he feels a pang of genuine regret at the thought of leaving a host of good friends, and he admits that he will miss the sociable atmosphere of Pirie.

His labor and recreation in the fields of commerce, science, art. and sport over a period of many years, as related to "The Recorder" yesterday, make an interesting story. Mr. Laver learned his trade as a bicycle manufacturer from W. Tyler, of Adelaide, whose workshop, he said, was one of only three in Australia which turned out its own cycle parts.

At the same time he studied electrical engineering' at Adelaide School of Mines, where he gained three certificates. PURCHASED CYCLE BUSINESS In 1903 he came to Pirie to manage a cycle shop for Massey Harris. The following year he went to Mount Gambier for the same employer, and in 1905 he purchased the Pirie business and came here to reside. In passing it may be mentioned that he has occupied seven different premises during his 32 years in the town.

Eighteen months after having set I himself up in business Mr. Laver began manufacturing his own cycles in a shop in Ellen street. He continued in that line of business for years and at one time had 13 boys and men working for him making and repairing machines.

He believes that he holds a record unique in Australia if not farther abroad, in that he manufactured 550 genuine B.S.A. cycles and three pattern machines. "And I believe that No. I machine, built in 1907, is still being ridden in Pirie," he said. When motor cars came into vogue, Mr. Laver added the sale and repair of the mechanised product to his business, and he sold more than 300 cars in Pirie while holding agencies.

He was called upon to do all classes of work, heavy and light. Whereas today a garage proprietor has merely to order a part for a client, years ago the mechanic, had to fashion them himself, often with makeshift tools, "Billy" Laver has turned to and made a crankshaft from a solid block and in the same breath he tells you that he once averaged $\pounds 2$ 10/ a month doing engraving for the two local jewellers.

Tendered for Big Electrical Job Electrical engineering was another string to his bow. "I tendered for the town electrical installation contract and lost it by ± 320 ," he said. That was a long time ago, but if my memory serves me right the contract price was about $\pm 7,000$.

Unbehaun and Johnstone Limited were the successful tenderers. "I had a big hand in preparing the specifications for the job, however. I strongly advocated alternating current, believing that it would be more economical, but it was turned down on the score of cost."

In 1911 he installed at Bishop's House, Gladstone—then occupied by Bishop Norton—a complete 100-volt plant. Costing \pounds 150, it was one of the largest private plants in the North.

Mr. Laver is a lover of music, and in his long association with Solomontown Methodist Church he found an an outlet for his card or. On and off he has conducted the choir for 16 or 17 years, and he was recently re elected as its leader. For years he sang as first tenor in Pirie Male Voice Choir, of which he was deputy con- ductor for several years. He is a life member of the organisation.

TEACHER FOR 30 YEARS Recently he relinquished the position of teaching the young men's class at his church—a labor of love which he carried on for 30 years. "They were fine chaps," he said, referring' to his pupils, many of whom now occupy high positions in the business world.

Rev. Charles B. Schafer had charge of the ministry here when Mr. Laver began his long association with the church. Mr. Laver remembers him as a vigorous preacher who was particularly "down" on intoxicating liquor. With a smile the old Piriean recalls that his was probaby the first "motor car wedding" in this town. The groom and his bride (formerly Miss May Bawden, daughter of a headmaster of Pirie School) were favored by sunshine during the ceremony, but they were glad of the protecting canopy which formed the hood of the vehicle as they drove away from the Methodist church in pouring rain.

Mr. Ted Limb, the groom's rival in business, drove the car. That was in 1909, and the now almost defunct, cab was the usual means of transport.

SUCCESS AT SPORT Mr. Laver played cricket with fair success as a member of the old Y.M.C.A. team, and later for about 17 years with Solomontown Culb in Pirie Association. Fielding was his forte.

In1923 he laid aside his cricket bat and took up the golf club. In his second year in the game he was runner -up in the club championship. He has always enjoyed his same of golf, which he deems the world's finest sport so far as individual skill is concerned. He plays no mean cue at billiards, and two or three years ago won the Institute Club championship. "I was a good marbles player, too, he remarked to the interviewer, with a chuckle. It is as an astronomer however, that Mr. Laver has found his favorite recreation. He purchased an expensive telescope, and for years he has been studying the heavens. His late father-inlaw interested him in the science and the two of them spent many happy hours taking transits of the stars, gazing through a sawcut in a post, and getting their calculations to within a few seconds of correct time.

Mr. Laver made a study of meteorites and discussed them with Mr. Dodwell, of the Observatory. He sent on to the latter photographs of an eclipse of the sun which he observed. Tracing the courses of obscure cornets was another of his pleasures in the world of astronomy. Before he came to Pirie he look a keen interest in Druids' Lodge, and he went through the chairs of the New Thebarton branch.

TALENTED FAMILY Mr. Laver and his wife, who is noted for her skill with the brush, passed on their love of art. to their daughters. Daphne (Mrs. L. A. Belcher) and Heather, who are accomplished musicians, the former with the violin and the latter at the piano.

"LAVER" CYCLE AND MOTOR WORKS.

Mr. W. E. N. Laver, of the "Laver' Cycle and Motor Works, Alexander St., showed five of the latest patterns in cycles, amongst them being a " Laver" Special and " Laver" Model 1.

Some fine samples of the good work done at the "Laver" Cycle and Motor Works, in the shape of steel, brass and copper polishing brazing work were also amongst the collection.

A special item of interest was a fine motorcycle — the "**Matchless**" — three and a half (3.5) horsepower, which at present holds the world's record, won on the famous Brooklands track, for speed.

Other notable lines were Newton McLaren electric lamps and shades, fans and motors, for which the local agency is located at the rear of the popular " Laver" Cycle and Motor Works.

Though the somewhat rough and ready annexe was not an attractive setting, the exhibit from Laver's Motor and Cycle Works was one worthy of more than a passing glance. The five machines displayed were all manufactured at Mr Laver's Alexander St establishment, as one might gather from the engraved trade mark, a capital "L" and a horse shoe intertwined. Among the bicycles was a Laver path racer, while a conspicuous feature was a photograph of a local athlete, Mr S. Konn, winner of the Demonstration Wheel Race. Owing to pressure of work the proprietor was unable to exhibit any new cars or motor cycles, though the very fact that he is unable to keep a permanent stock surely says more for the quality of work produced than any number of unsold samples. The only motor cycle on view was one built by Mr Laver for Mr J. Bottrall two years ago, which still shows but little sign of the constant use to which it has been subjected. In awarding the whole exhibit a prize the judges complimented both the builder and present owner on the cycle's perfect state of preservation. Mr Laver has recently moved into commodious premises in Alexander Street, where, with more room, better appliances, and a staff of experienced assistants, he is prepared to cope with all the demands of cyclists and motorists.

25th ANNIVERSARY RALLY our SILVER ANNIVERSARY.

The second time we ventured into Anniversary Rallies was for our 25th. As this was our Silver Anniversary we had a special Badge, our club badge done in silver instead of gold. The rally was centred in the Barossa Valley. The Organisers were Clem Evans and Leslie Jones and the rally Routes for two days riding were done by Dean Govan and Peter Grace. It was held Easter Weekend of 1981, Of course the Easter traffic was nothing like it is today, but we still kept the riders off the Main road as much as possible.

There were 109 riders: 13 veterans, 41 Vintage and the rest up to the 1950s. Of these 52 came from other states from Western Australia right through to Queensland. In those days we had to get a "Permit to Ride" from the Registrar to take an unregistered/historic vehicle on to the road. You can imagine the reaction of the bloke at the registrar when Leslie turned up there with 52 applications for permits. However they were very accommodating and next day they were collected all in alphabetical order! On the Friday night we had a Wine tasting and get together for the Entrants. Day 1 was 124 kms and we rode through Koonunga, Kapunda Tarlee, Templars, Greenock and back to Nuriootpa,

Day 2 was 106 kms and we travelled through Angaston, Menglers Hill Lookout, Seppeltsfield to Greenock oval where Alan Webster and his helpers cooked us a great BBQ lunch. Then returned to Nuriootpa. Dinner each night was at Hoffman's Winery. Arrangements had been made via the rally forms for voting in 25 different categories and these trophies were awarded on the last night.

We finished up with a farewell Breakfast on the Monday morning.

More On Mack Trucks

The Mack Brothers Company was incorporated in New York in 1901 with John M. (Jack). Augustus F (Gus) and William C. (Willie) Mack as directors. From 1904 the brothers adopted the Manhattan name for their vehicles and in 1905 formed Mack Brothers Motor Car Co. in Lehigh County, Pennsylvania, with production facilities at Allentown facilities at Allentown.

From 1910 it was decided to drop the Manhattan name and call the trucks Mack. The first trucks of 1905 were a bonneted 1 to 2-tonner and forward-control models for 3, 4 and 5 tons payload - all powered by Mack's own design of gasoline engine.

To raise further capital the International Motor Company was formed in 1911 as a holding company for the Mack Brothers Motor Car Co. and the Saurer Motor Co. The latter built Swiss Saurer trucks under

license. A significant development was the

introduction of the medium-weight AB of 1914 followed in 1915 by the legendary AC. It was the AC's rugged performance during World War I that impressed the British soldiars, so much so that they durbed it the soldiers, so much so that they dubbed it the

An early example of Mack's legendary AC Bulldog dating from 1917. Around 40,000 ACs were built between 1915 and 1938.

"Bulldog"

The name stuck and from 1922 the famous bulldog motif was adopted as Mack's corporate symbol.

Over the years more famous models appeared, such as the BJ and BB of 1927. Then came the streamlined medium -duty Mack E models of 1936 with payload ratings up to 4 tons

Heavier E models followed, including the 6-ton shaft-drive EM, 6-ton chain-drive ER and EQ tractors for

10 to 12 tons. During World War II Mack was a major supplier of personnel carriers. wreckers and tank transporters.

The Ride once again starts from the **National Motor Museum Birdwood**. Enter through the gate off of Blumel Rd after 9.00am (*Ed. see map this page*). Park trailers at the rear of the buildings on the left and form up on the roadway alongside of the lawn area.

After the usual riders briefing, we will head off at 10.00am.

We will travel down the main road through **Gumeracha** and turn left into the **Gorge Road**. Another left turn at **Cudlee Creek** and the main ride will turn right up **Fox Creek Road to Lenswood**.

Veteran and Tiddler bikes.

Instead of turning they can go straight on at **Fox Creek Road**, to go straight through to **Lobethal**, **to turn right to the refreshment stop**.

Long Route riders.

At **Lenswood** the main route turns down **Swamp Road** to turn left into **Oakwood Road to Oakbank**. Turning left, then through **Woodside** to turn left at the roundabout to the **refreshment break at Lobethal**.

After the break we will all head through on the main roads to **Birdwood**, **via Mt Torrens**. Crossing over the Main street of **Birdwood onto Cromer Road** to turn left into **Lucky Hit Road onto Martins Hill Road**. Right into **Forreston Road** onto **Warren Road** to right turn onto **Cricks Mill Road to Mt Pleasant**. A right turn will put us onto the main road **back to the Museum at Birdwood**.

On arrival back at the Museum the bikes will be judged by the Museum Staff for their Annual Trophy. We should arrive back early afternoon, so this will give you plenty of time to go to one of the cafes in the main street opposite the Museum for something to eat. The rest of the afternoon can be spent looking at the various displays in the Museum, at no extra cost to you.
