

Triumph The Royal Connections

During the period of the Triumph Meriden Cooperative there were 3 Limited Edition models built with Royal connotations.


The first of these were the **1977 Silver Jubilee Bonneville's**. One of a Thousand' the advertising blurb said. In actual fact there were around 1,000 built for England, 1,000 built for America and approx. 400 for other parts of the World. A total of around 2,400, with two versions available, the UK spec bikes and US spec bikes. The difference was the UK bikes had 4 gallon petrol tanks (with rubber knee pads) and low handlebars while the US spec had a 2 ½ gallon tank and high handlebars. Both specs were sold in the various markets.



Both versions were the standard bikes blinged up. They had silver paint with a blue scallop on the tank lined with red and white lining. The mudguards, wheel rims and chain guard also had blue stripes with the red/white lining. The engine timing cover, primary cover, outer gearbox cover and tail light housing were chrome plated (not really a good idea on aluminum). The dark blue seats had red piping and `Silver Jubilee' under the Triumph name on the back of the seat. They also had s new style side cover with a special badge rading `Bonneville 750, Silver Jubilee 1977' Then there was the wording at the bottom which read either `One of a Thousand', `Limited Edition' or `Limited International Edition' depending on which market it went to. Each bike also came with a certificate listing the Limited Edition number, bike number and a space for the first owners name.

Then in 1981 it was decided to do another run of Limited Edition bikes, this time to celebrate the wedding of Prince Charles to Lady Diana Spencer. They would be called the `Royal Wedding Bonneville'. However, this time they were restricted to much smaller numbers. The general consensus is there were 125 UK spec bikes and 125 US spec bikes (with some sources stating, incorrectly, that these went to America), 250 total. My research to date is indicating this may not be correct, but I'm still working on that.

The US spec bikes were, once again, blinged up standard bikes with the 2 ½ gallon petrol tank and high handlebars. The petrol tank was chrome plated with blue scallops lined in gold. The side covers were blue with a gold pin-



The UK spec bikes also had chrome plated 4 gallon petrol tanks, mudguards and rear brake levers. The tanks had a black scallop with gold lining. The side covers were also black with a gold pinstripe and the black chain guard had a gold pinstripe. The engine was also finished in black with the edges of the fins on the cylinder head and rocker boxes polished. The frame and swing arm were finished in silver along with the fork yokes. The seat was black. The wheels were Morris mag wheels with twin disc on the front with alloy Lockheed calipers.

All Royal Wedding models had electric starters and Bing CV carby's. There was a plate fixed the frame on the left side of the headstock saying it was a Royal Wedding Limited Edition model and had the Limited Edition number and frame number stamped onto it. The side cover badges had `Bonneville Royal 1981' on them with a small `Limited Edition' sticker at the bottom. Each bike also came with a Certificate with the LE number, original dealer name and first Owners name

Initially the Americans didn't want the any of the Royal Weddings, but upon seeing the success of them in the UK and other countries they asked Triumph to do another run. These are not `Royal Weddings' though. They are the `Royal LE's, built for Triumph Motorcycles America (TMA).

The **TMA Royal LE** is virtually the same bike as the UK spec Royal Wedding but all paintwork is black with gold pinstripes including petrol tank, mudguards, side covers and chain guards. The only chrome plating other than the usual exhaust system handle bars etc, is the rear brake lever. The engine cases were finished in black with polished timing, primary and gearbox covers. The side cover badges read `Bonneville Royal' with the small `Limited Edition' sticker at the bottom. They weren't individually numbered like the previous LE bikes and only about 50 of them were built, making them one of the rarest Triumph models built.

Footnote; There were 25 Royal Weddings despatched to Australia. Of those 9 were US spec bikes and 16 were UK spec bikes. Four of them came to Boltons in SA, 3 UK and 1 US spec bikes. I know the whereabouts of the 3 UK spec bikes but are yet to track down the US spec bike. Of the rest of the bikes, most went to Alron in Perth and Tom Byrne in Sydney. The remainder went to M&W. There are also two UK spec Royal Weddings privately imported from the UK that I know of. If you had, have or know someone who has, a Royal Wedding, I would be keen to hear from you. 
I thought some Club Members might be interested in my former motorcycle competitive years.

My competitive days in fact began with the purchase of a 1952 Triumph 650cc Thunderbird in the early 1960s. I'd spotted this machine resting for some considerable time up against the wall of a market gardeners home, Dominic, I was friendly with. I asked if it might be for sale and what he might like for it. Having offered Dom £25 deposit for the 50 Quid asking price he allowed me to ride the bike home the 3 miles all be it unregistered Dom never did request the 25 Quid balance

It was not long before my best mate Peter Richards and myself were preparing to attach a sidecar to the model. We were both Members of the now defunct Norwood Motorcycle Club who met in George Street at the back of the convenient old Norwood Pie Cart. President of the Club at the time was Harold Murray who operated a motorcycle repair shop in George Street. While there on one occasion an old chap pulled up in the street on a 1938 500cc Triumph. Leaving his machine with Harold for some work to be attended to while he went shopping on the Parade I asked if he would mind if I swapped my Hydraulic forks for his much earlier Girder type forks. Half an hour later when he returned found the replaced forks to his liking riding away most excited.

Harold usually had all manner of scrap bits and pieces lying about when on one occasion he had a Triumph front portion frame grafted to a twin shock Norton Plunger rear section. I took it home and swapped each over with the girder forks and there was the beginning of racing outfit. I knew of Dave Williams Motorcycle Wreckers in Whitmore Square. Dropping in at one stage, searching for whatever I caught sight of a 16" Austrian 250cc Adler 180mm brake front wheel that would suit our job perfectly.

As for the rear wheel we had Gordon 'Bismark' Harding of Miracorp Safely Rims in Gilles Street lace up a 13"x 6" car rim to our standard Triumph brake drum and had fitted a Winter tread tyre of the time. Allparts in Flinders



I'd never ridden the Triumph before we went to Mallala road races on my 21st birthday for the South Australian Road Race Championships were we managed 5th place overall. Soon after did the money eventually dry out and was forced to quit the Triumph.

During this early period, I was to support another of my best mates, Neil Munro as mechanic at Rowley Park Speedway through the early 1960s. Another friend Daryl Read was riding with Neil when after breaking his leg at Murray Bridge forcing Neil to find another Passenger for the speedway on Friday nights. This offer was made to 'you know who'. This was then about to get awkward. Maureen and I were yet to be married and the ultimation was made, If I was to side speedway the wedding was off. Our wedding plans had been









made not that far into the future. Can you see where I'm going here? Well, we got married and never so proud of myself **(not)** I began riding speedway with Neil on the HRD.

Our immediate first outing together was in 1964 at the Easter long weekend meeting at Pt. Pirie on the one mile circuit for five miles duration. I remember the chain broke while practicing wrapping itself around my right boot having to be attended by the on course St. John Ambos Motorcycle Division, we did complete the weekend racing.

Opening night however in 1965 at Rowley Park we, lined up at the tapes from gate number one we managed first into turn one. However, into turn two Kenny Norman thought sufficient room was there to nudge through knocking our bike into neutral loosing total power resulting in

our end over ending. That would be my initiation to the Sidecar Stars Scratch Race. The outcome, both

walked away mostly unscathed.

Our Son Todd was born in July of 1969 when I finally had had sufficient speedway excitement then purchased my first of several Observed Trial bikes a 250cc DT1 Yamaha. Campaigning that for a season when multi World Champion Trials Mastro from the UK, Sammy Miller visited South Australia conducting trials schools in each state for the Spanish Bultaco factory.

It wasn't long before my good mate Peter Richards and I invested in a Bultaco Sherpa 'T' each, Peter's seven engine numbers ahead of mine. I rode solo for a season before building my first Trials sidecar outfit determined to make a name solely for myself as a rider.

Having taken part in no less than 18 National Title events every state throughout the country, we were most fortunate to placed first in two titles, one in 1973 at Loongana in Tasmania and another in 1974 at Lismore in New South Wales. While the little Bultaco was came

paigned, we managed several local and interstate Titles throughout Victoria and New South Wales traveling thousands of kilometers every year. From there the younger competitive generation took over relegating me to seconds and third and much lesser placings.

Further up the track, having sold off the Bully we invested in our first of several Yamaha TY250 model Trials machine at the time said to be the ultimate in Trials machines following the visit from another Englishman, Mick Andrews having taken over from Sammy Miller as the man to beat in World Championship Trials events throughout England and Europe.

Immediately attaching in the off season, a lightweight sidecar to the brand new Yamaha model. I have to admit here my days of leading the fields to the rostrum were now well and truly over as the youngsters coming up through the ranks were much less afraid of the more difficult observed sections now being provided by the organizers to negotiate.

Campaigning another two Yamaha TY models before purchasing a lovely little 250cc TLR Honda for the couple of years I had remaining as a competitor. I'd always had a yearning to ride over, not leap over a VW Volksy on an outfit from as early as the mid-1980s Uraidla and Summertown Agricultural Show. Not until the AJS Motorcycle Club in Adelaide provided a Trials display at the Boolaroo Center Steam and Traction Day in 1986 did I have the opportunity to accomplish this long awaited achievement. Since then, with my fearless regular passenger Stephen Sparkes did we have the opportunity to negotiated several other successful attempts at the Birdwood Farm Day and once only an Austin 1800 Tasman at Speedway Park Virginia.

Having suffered a mild Myocardial Infarction (Heart Attack) in 1989 my days of open competition were now well and truly over since I'd retired three times already. I turned to purchasing a 1954 model 16M 350cc AJS and joined the Veteran and Vintage Motorcycle Club

in Adelaide to go riding with Club Members I'd long known.

Having now since 1974 achieved more than 4 different Club Life Memberships I'm more than pleased with my overall contribution to competitive motorcycling.

On seeing this photo in the June " Smoke Signal " my memory was taken back to October 1987 when we attended the "Wheels West 87" tour of Perth & Busselton in W.A. This rally was promoted by the Vintage Motorcycle Club of W.A.

In answer to Brian's question, the picture shows Jeff & Dawn Schaefer with their 1929 side valve" Sloper" BSA with Goulding sidecar at York, West Australia on 11/10/1987



Dawn and I were accompanied by Laurie& Ruth Leibhart (1954 Matchless &S/C), Lew & Lorraine Job (1952 Norton &S/C) Peter & Rhonda Monaghan (1951 Panther) Brian & Mary Farmer (1936 Vincent HRD) John & Joan Howard (1954 BSA) and Chris Dowsett (1948 BSA).

Entrants came from Victoria 6, Queensland 5, New Zealand 21 and South Australia 6 for a total of 121. (12 veteran, 32vintage).

The large number of entrants from NZ was due to a reciprocal arrangement and a shipping line transporting the machines quite cheaply.

The rally was conducted from Sat 10th October to Sunday 25th October at the height of the West Australian Wildflower season. It covered Perth and then the South West on scenic routes covering approx. 1000 Kms.

On Sunday as entrants in the "Wheels West 87" we were invited to ride in the W.A. T.T. Commemoration Run of 150 kms over the course used in the series of races held in 1912/13/14 and 15.

Starting In East Perth, we rode to York returning via Northam and Tooday. As I had only just restored the Sloper (it had about 40 kms on the clock) pulling up through the Perth hills was a real "running in" for the BSA. We completed the course in the allotted time, whatever that was? & we gained a Silver Award. I must confess every entrant that completed the course was awarded according to their classification. Veteran =Gold, Vintage= Silver, Post vintage = Bronze.

We then visited many other places of scenic interest around the Perth area including Rottnest Island until the 17th October when the Tour moved southward to the Busselton area. The visit to see the famous Jarrah and Karri forests was spectacular. We were lucky that the West Australian wildflowers were at their peak, and it was amazing to see paddocks full of blooms of various colours. (Canola doesn't compete.) During the Tour we had a Rest Day and a Gymkhana Day with Australia versa New Zealand Teams Relay Races. I cannot remember who won but I do know there was some skullduggery afoot.

The Tour moved back to Perth for a final Rally Dinner on the 25^{th} and next day after thanking our hosts for an excellent Rally , we set off for home

On the 2 hour drive home I worked out what caused the problem. Yesterday I thought I would give the Thunderbird a check over before todays ride. Checked valve clearances, chain tensions, oil levels and fixed the headlight that wasn't working. Then at the last minute I thought I'd better check the points. Gap was fine and I decided to just check the screw that fixes the points to the armature. That's when the magneto shaft must have slipped in the timing gear taper a few degrees. Now if this had been a customers bike the last thing I would have done was given it a test run and immediately found something wasn't right. But no, I loaded it into the van and didn't find out til this morning that something wasn't right when I had so much trouble getting it started. <u>`RIDE IN/DRIVE IN VISIT 20 JULY '25 @ 10.00am</u> ARMY MUSEUM OF SA

It's that time of the year again when the weather is not always conducive for motorcycle riding. A visit to the **Army Museum on Anzac Highway Keswick** has been arranged, with this in mind.

If the weather is wet, cold, hop in your heated car, with the wipers on and drive there in comfort.

We have not visited this site for several years and this may be the last time we will have the opportunity to see these displays.

The Government is selling the Barracks and the Museum is to be disbanded. Some of the items may be going to various RSL Clubs around the City.

Outside they have armoured tanks and vehicles, with the main displays inside, out of the weather. Here you will see dioramas of battlefields, weapons, uniforms, badges, insignia, personal items and so the list can go on.

It is very well set out and the volunteer Staff are very knowledgeable.

They have agreed to open just for our group at 10.00am and give us a guided tour.

The general public will be admitted, as usual at 11.00am.

The cost is \$5.00 per person.

You are more than welcome to bring family and friends with you.

The Museum is just inside the Keswick Barracks and parking is available on the grounds.

When coming down Anzac Highway from the City the entrance gate is immediately after bus stop No.2. There are Museum signs at the entrance.

If coming up Anzac Highway from South Road, you will go past the entrance and then do a U-turn (look for the signs on the median strip), to then enter after the No 2 Bus stop.

Please be there well before 10.00am so as we can pay and be ready for the tour.
