
For without your participation we may not be able to continue the tradition of preservation and restorations of motorcycles especially the veteran and vintage scene, followed by all of the other motorcycles members have



BACK UP TRAILER DUTIES

Arrive at plenty of time at the start venue.

Make yourself known to the Ride Leader at the start.

Make sure that you have filled out a Rally entry form.

Exchange mobile phone numbers with the Ride Leader, if possible, so if there are any problems during the ride, contact can be made to sort them out.

Get a map of the route, if possible, and discuss any details. timing etc with the Leader.

Ensure that you have received the First Aid kit, fire extinguisher, fire blankets, and a safety vest for yourself.

Make sure that these are returned to the person who supplied them to you or their nominee, at the end.

Make a note if anything was used from the **First Aid kit** and let the person responsible know, so as it can be refreshed.

When the ride gets underway, before you leave (start, refuel stop, regroup or refreshment stop etc) make sure that all bikes have started and have left the area.

During the ride keep well behind the last rider so as not to pressure them, or to create an obstacle for passing traffic.

Do not pass any of the bikes on the ride.

Whilst travelling keep a good lookout for any bikes that may have stopped or broken down on the roadside.

When coming up to a Corner Marshal take notice of which way the route goes. It is also helpful to flash your lights, so as they realise that it is you approaching. If possible/safe, park behind them till they are underway. If it is not possible/safe to do so, go past them and as soon as it is safe, pull to the side and let them get in front of you.

When recovering a bike make sure that you are parked in as safe a position as possible and be aware of passing traffic.

Do not spend more than a couple of minutes, waiting for the rider to try and start their bike. Any delay holds up the ride and has the possibility of marshals leaving their corner.

Ensure that the bike is firmly secured to the trailer, to the rider's satisfaction, before moving.

Thank you for your help, keep safe and enjoy the Event.

Two for the road

and Albert "Pop" Hill, 68, will ride in the Adelaide to Glenelg commemorative run on September 28.

The run is part of the week-long National Veteran and Vintage car rally, which will begin on Sunday.

Wally says his 1910 AJS is one of two in the world. The other is in the UK.

He's known this machine for more than 50 years and has owned it for 15 years.

Wally's life has always been associated with motor cycles and he has entered scores of rallies. At least 18 Australian records tumbled to Wally's riding.

"Pop" Hill, who began riding motor cycles only 10 years ago-in veteran events-will ride his 1907 Motoreve in the commemorative run.

It's a small, Swiss-made machine with a V-twin engine of about 2

h.p. and is the only known one in Australia, according to "Pop."

The Veteran and Vintage Car Rally will start in Adelaide on Sunday.

Mr. George Green, of Castlecrag (NSW), who is considered the father of veteran and vintage cars in Australia, will enter the rally in his 1928 Bugatti, a car built essentially for racing and which has competed in many Le Mans events.

Mr. Green owns about 60 veteran and vintera vehicles, some of which he keeps at his home. Ho has custodians for the others.

George Green instigated the Vintage Car Club of Australia, and has held most positions on the NSW and National Veteran and Vintage Car







Mere motorcycle miffs motoring majority

Most historic-vehicle enthusiasts managed a stiff upper lip during a wet second Bay-to-Birdwood Run yesterday.

But some were slightly upset that the perpetual trophy in the Concours d'Elegance was awarded to a mere motorcycle

Mr. Terry Parker won the trophy, judged on the presentation of both the vehicle and passenger, with his 1908 Matchless motorcycle with JAP (John Arthur Preston) motor and wicker sidecar.

"It's incredible for a motorbike to win an event like this," he said.

It had taken him about 18 months

fully to restore the Matchless from a bare frame.

Many entrants with open cars left Birdwood before the announcement of the winner when persistent rain with occasional hail set in about I p.m.

Entrants who had gone to considerable trouble outfitting themselves as 1930s gangsters complete with machineguns, or foppish *Brideshead Revisited* types with teddy bears, remained huddled in their cars for much of the afternoon.

of the afternoon.

Officials had trouble reading the judges' scores because rain had made the ink run.

Among the intrepid who completed the run were two men on pennyfarthing

bicycles, and Mr. Paul Kruger, 84, on his 1919 Indian motorcycle. Several motorcyclists were stranded

Several motorcyclists were stranded with wet magnetos and various other problems.

The chairman of the judging panel, Mr. W. Jamieson, said the rain did not deter many entrants.

"We had 966 official entries and virtually all turned up at the start and virtually everyone made it to Birdwood." he said.

wood," he said.
"We had fashion parades planned with clothes from 1880 to 1950, but the stage was so slippery and the materials would have suffered too much, so that had to be cancelled.

"Everything else has gone to

"Most of the owners are very careful the cars are handled with kid gloves.

"While we would not want to come out on a day like this, they would not miss the Bay-to-Birdwood Run."

Mr. Jamieson said the number of entries had increased by nearly 50 p.c. over the last run.

Ten teams of three judges chose the 20 finalists, then all judges individually assessed each finalist to decide the winner.

The perpetual trophy was presented to Mr. Parker by TV interviewer Michael Parkinson, who took delight in gloating over the wet weather.

"Being a Pom, I'm waterproof," he said.

The sidecar had some timberwork repaired and was repainted in 2019.

In England the bike completed many veteran and vintage rallies.

These included many London Brighton Pioneer Runs and the Graham Walker Memorial Run.

The Indian was purchased by my brother and I from family and came to Adelaide in 2023.

It was given a good clean and "going over" to get it ready for the road. The petrol tank was cleaned out and resealed.

All the paint and plating are as it was after it was restored 62 years ago.

It was then inspected and registered for the first time since 1992.

It is now proudly back on the road.

THE 1926 Norton 16H (490cc SV)

Once upon a time in a land far away there lived a man who worked as a tractor mechanic and one day he was called upon to repair a tractor on a farm at Redhill, near Crystal Brook. On that farm he saw an old rusty Norton motorcycle leaning against a post in the cow yard. Sometime later he mentioned it to his friend Neville Govan and sometime later Neville mentioned it to his brother Dean.

I had developed an interest in Nortons when I helped Fred Wilkinson with maintenance of his OHV machine and had told Dean that I would like a Norton, to which Dean said, "I know where there is one".

So, on a drizzly winter's morning in 1969 Dean & I arrived on the Wheaton's farm to be warmly welcomed by Harry who_after the usual pleasantries led us to the cow yard. There it was a SV flat tank Norton with no visible paint on it, tires & rims disappearing into the muddy slop of the yard, leaning against a post. We had a look and found that it was reasonably complete although the footrests had been replaced with lumps of steel from one of Harry's old ploughs.

Harry told us that he and his brother had bought the Norton in the early 1930s and had toured around the mid north of South Australia on it. Harry said that around 1949 he was using it to round up the cows when the rear tire blew out. As the BE 26x3 tyres where unprocurable, he pushed it into the yard & lent it against the post. Sometime later the yard was used to store hay, so the stack was built over the Norton and this probably helped to preserve it, a little.

"Harry, do you want to sell it?" "No" " Harry, if you don't want to sell it, could we move it into the implement shed out of the weather?" "No thanks". Harry then said "look it's a lousy day; my wife has gone shopping, come and have a cuppa". I was mystified; he did not want to sell it or take our offer to help preserve it. As he prepared the tea &biscuits Harry talked about the trips, the adventures, all the good times that he and his brother had had with the Norton.

I realized it was not the machine but the memories that were woven into it that he did not want to lose. I put a proposal to Harry that he would retain ownership of the bike, but I would have five years' use of it in exchange for restoring it. Harry would reimburse me, at the end of the agreement, for any parts and materials that I had to purchase during the restoration. Harry agreed to this proposal, so an agreement was written & signed with Dean as the witness.

In about 18 months it was restored enough to be rideable and on the 27th of November 1971 rode it to Kadina on the VVMCC Two Day Rally for its first outing. On Sunday Harry & his wife met us at the lunch stop at Balaklava and inspected it, he was happy to see it going & looking good again.

In 1974 I wrote to Harry and informed him that I had entered the Norton for display at the Crystal Brook Show and we should talk about our agreement. During the day Harry was seen talking to some of his friends about the Norton and later in the afternoon he and his wife had a talk with me. He said that if he took the bike back it would slowly deteriorate and as his family were not interested in it, I could keep it. Thank You Harry.

Harry did not know that his daughter Pam would marry Neville Grey, a member of the Ulysses Club, and they contacted me about buying the Norton. By that time, I had other vintage bikes, so I decided to sell the Norton back to the family. Some years later Neville sold the Norton to Rob Elliott, a VVMCSA member The Norton was ridden in many Club runs with different riders, David Radloff, Darryl Rosser, Neville Roach, Dave Birrell and John Michelbach to name a few. As "Pa" Norton was a strong Salvationist the bike was on display at Westminster College during a Salvation Army Conference.


In April/May 1984, I rode it on The Alpine 1000 (Melbourne to Omeo , Mount Hotham, Bright, Mount Buffalo, Albury to Footscray). Coming back into Melbourne on the Tullamarine Freeway it paced the traffic at 95 to 100 kph. Not bad for an old lady.+







The longer ride will start from the OTR Service Station in Kersbrook, corner of Scott (main road) and James Street. We will leave at 10am after the usual riders briefing.



Travelling up the South Para Road through Williamstown to the Village Green at Lyndoch, via Lyndoch Valley Road, where we meet the Veteran and Tiddler bikes, who will be ready to leave at 10.30am.

The riders who trailer their bikes to Lyndoch may park their trailers on the Barossa Valley Way, (the road coming in from Gawler), on the verge amongst the trees on the Gawler side of the Village Green Parking area. This is the parking area that we use on the annual Kersbrook Tiddlers Run, almost opposite the Sunrise Bakery. Please leave the main parking area free for other people visiting during the day.

A deviation will be taken just before the Seppeltsfield Winery onto Gerald Roberts Road to Gomersal Road. Here a left turn, then a right onto Lyndoch Road, past the picturesque Chateau Yaldara, to return to the Lyndoch Village Green.

After saying our goodbyes, the longer riders will return to Kersbrook the way they came, so as you can see the other sides of the trees.

The roads are mainly flat, with flowing corners through the Barossa Valley with a few longer, gradual hills on the return to Lyndoch. These hills shouldn't be a big challenge to the lower powered Veteran and Tiddlers.

The distance. For the longer ride is approximately 125 kms and the
